

NSS and Youth Red Cross students were participated. They were asked so many questions and clear the doubts.







Women cell organised a **health awareness programme** on 13th December, 2018 at San Joes Seminar Hall. Dr. Prof. Arthur Joseph Asirvatham, MD (General Medicine), D. Diab, Arthur Asirvatham Hospitals. A most experienced doctor who has published more than 14 books, 70 research papers recently on prevention of metabolism, he had organised many "patient friendly" medical camp. The programme started with a prayer song. Ms. Soundarya of I B.Com welcomed the chief guest. Ms Raagam NSS, Coordinator honoured the chief guest with a memento. The guest of honour Dr. Prof. Arthur Joseph Asirvatham delivered the Awareness speech on Hepatitis.

Dr. Prof. Arthur Joseph Asirvatham in his speech addressed the types, causes, symptoms and treatment of Hepatitis. The highlights of his speech not limited as given below.

He has differentiated the types of hepatitis as

- **Hepatitis** the word denotes liver inflammation
- There are three types of Hepatitis A, B and C. Hep A is a communicable disease and B and C are blood borne and dangerous.
- Alcoholic hepatitis occurs in alcoholic consuming people
- Auto immune hepatitis is rare occurs in joint points
- Sterio- non alcoholic hepatitis causes diabetes.

He also pointed out the symptoms and treatments for hepatitis which includes,

- Loss of appetite, passing high coloured urine, Conjunctiva, stomach pain, extreme tiredness
- No specific antiviral drug, Only nutritional supplement such as adequate calories, vitamin, bed rest etc.,
- Prevention: Hygiene
- Test: serum Bilrubin < 1 mg' liver enzymes AST, ALT < 40

At last Dr. Prof. Arthur Joseph Asirvatham advised the students about the importance of immunization. The programme came to an end with the vote of thanks (Ms.Yalini I year Sociology)
