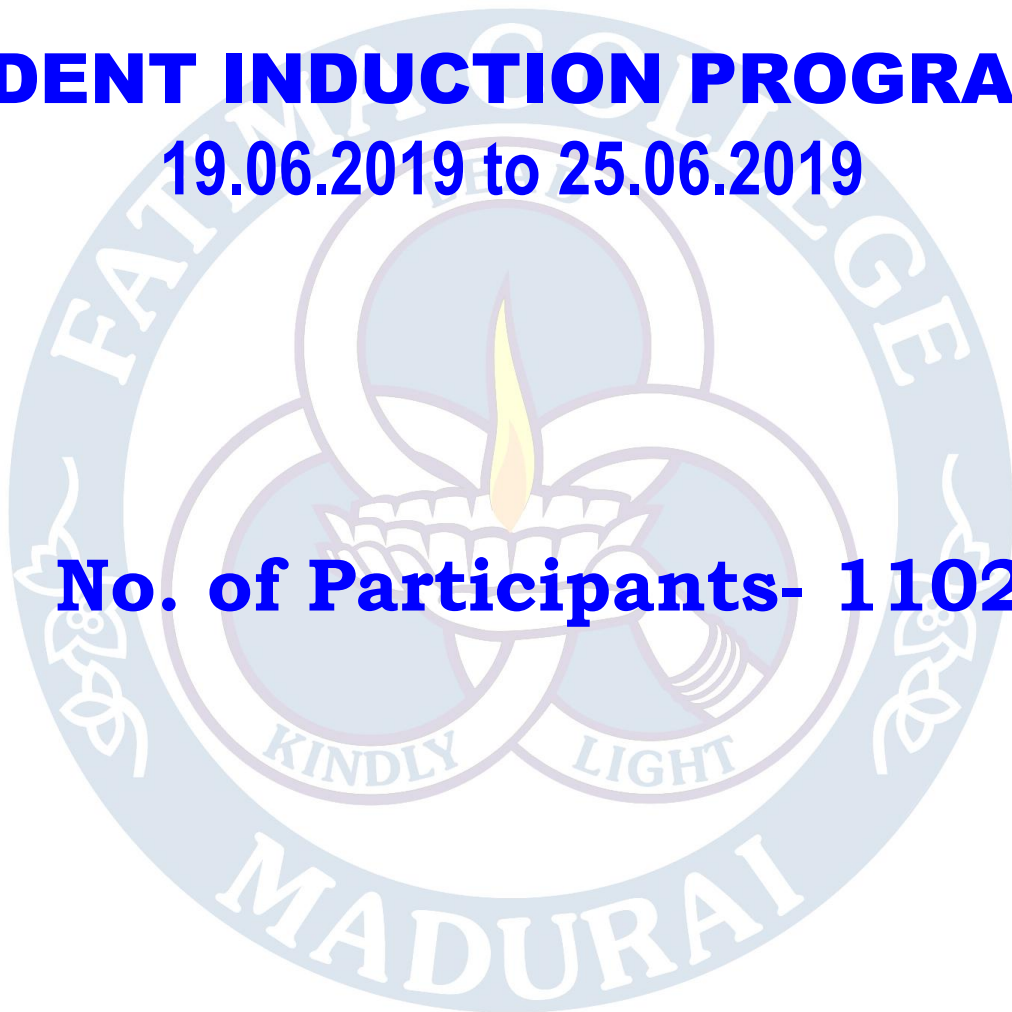

Report on Student Induction Programme organized by IQAC

June 19 - 25, 2019

The IQAC of Fatima College organized a Student Induction Programme from June 19 – 25, 2019. The sessions were planned following the UGC guidelines for the conduct of the programme. The entire week was meticulously planned and split into twelve sessions to get the newly admitted students oriented and accustomed to the culture and curriculum of Fatima College and to provide them with various information related to college. The SIP (Student Induction Programme) began with Dr. S. Vidya, Associate Professor of Computer Science and Coordinator IQAC, introducing the objectives and purpose of SIP to the first year students. The second session was handled by Dr. S. Saira Banu, Associate Professor of English and Assistant IQAC Coordinator who conducted few ice-breaking sessions and shared some basic information about the college. A video about the college was also shown to the girls.

On the second day the students were oriented about 'What it is to be a Fatimite'. This session was effectively handled by Dr. Mary Magdalene Abraham, Associate Professor of English and Assistant IQAC Coordinator, Fatima College. Session IV was handled by Mr. H. Vincent, Placement Coordinator, who spoke on the various job opportunities for students. Mr. Vincent listed the various renowned companies that come every year for campus recruitment. He also spoke on the various training sessions on career guidance conducted for the students to equip them for the job market. He also made the students aware about the effective functioning of the Placement Cell of Fatima College.

The sessions on the following days were as follows:

- Dr. R. Velankanni Matharasi, Physical Directress, spoke on the importance of mental and physical fitness,
- Dr. S. J. Kala, Dean of Arts, Associate Professor of English, Fatima College enlightened the students about the curriculum pattern of the college

- Ms. G. Revathi, Assistant Professor of Tamil, Fatima College, briefed on the activities undertaken by the Environmental Education Cell and made the students conscious about the need to safeguard our nature.
- Dr. Ivy Jenö, Associate Professor of Economics, Fatima College oriented the students about MAM (Meditation in Action Movement). MAM is a forum in Fatima College that teaches yoga and meditation to all students.

- Ms. A. Sheela Roselin, Assistant Professor of Mathematics and Ms. A. Mable Jasmine Shoba, Assistant Professor of Commerce with Computer Applications jointly oriented the girls about the Ethical Studies Cell of Fatima College and how they will be learning good values amidst academics.

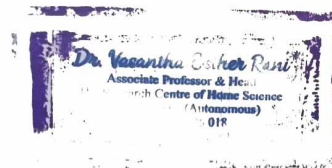
The Induction Programme came to a close with a feedback session. The feedback was positive and the students felt integrated into the Fatima College Community.

Through this session students got to know more knowledge in appearing for an interview and also it has changed the perception towards the interview difficulties.



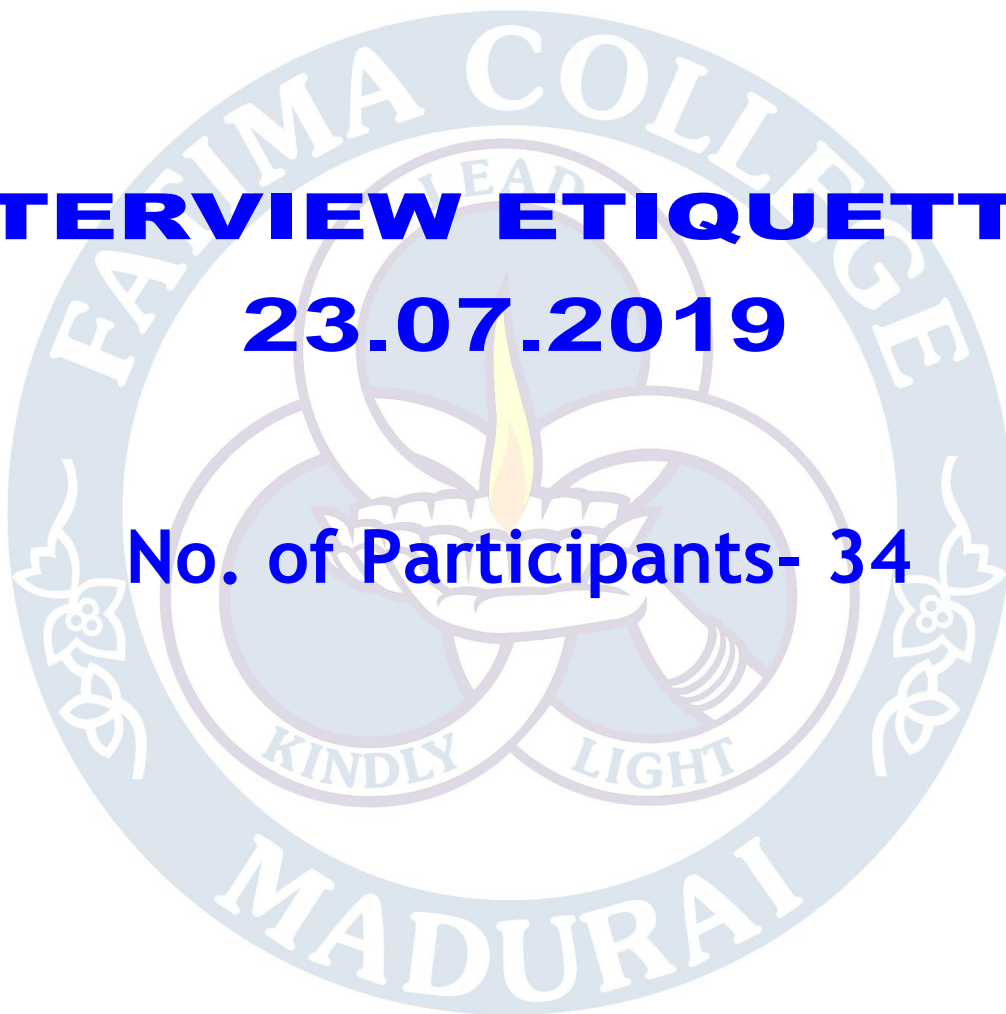

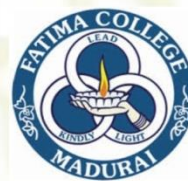

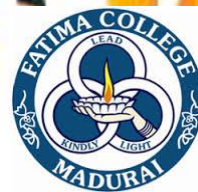

In order to give an awareness related to Honour Killing, the Department of Sociology and Social Work organized “SOCIAS” meet on the Topic ‘Honour Killing’- Myths and Reality. The Chief Guest for the meet is Mr.A.Kathir, Founder and Executive Director, Evidence, Madurai.

In his speech, he mentioned that “The Topic is pertinent and need of the hour to discuss today”. He emphasized the causes and consequences of honour Killing based on various discriminations in the society like Gender, Class and Caste. During last five years, there are 192 honour killings happened in our country, he said. Also he insisted that the intensity of the Caste consciousness among the people leads to honour killing more than any other reasons in the society. The parents are very much conscious about caste and they believe that the caste is more important than their children he said. As a Sociologists and Social Worker, the students must be aware about the reasons behind the social evils and they should raise questions towards the same to eliminate from the society he told.

Also he presented many case studies on honour killing which he dealt with based on caste discrimination. In 2011 the law related to Honour killing have been passed by our government he said. The students were really enlightened by his speech.

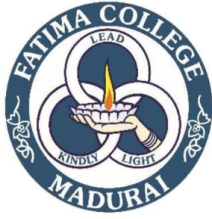

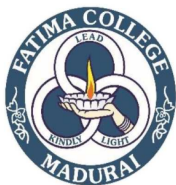

A 3-DAY ONLINE WORKSHOP ON

“WALKING THROUGH THE WOODS: MIND SET AND SKILL SET DEVELOPMENT” (16th July 2020 to 18th July 2020)

REPORT

The Department of Business Administration and Department of English (Shift II) jointly organized a three day workshop on “Walking Through the Woods: Mind Set and Skill Set Development” from 16th to 18th July, 2020, 11.00 a.m. – 12.30 p.m. Prof. R.Raja Govindasamy, Former Principal of Thiagarajar College, Madurai, Academic Advisor and Life Skills Trainer and Dr. D.Helen Christina, Assistant Professor, Sri Meenakshi Government Arts College for Women, Madurai, Counsellor and Psychotherapist were the eminent resource persons of the three day workshop. 262 student participants of the self financing section of Fatima College enthusiastically took part in the Workshop. The workshop provided an overview of the skills essential for a career aspirant to cope with the competition that prevails today.



DAY 1 OF THE WORKSHOP

The first day of the workshop was entitled “The Woods are Lovely” (An Exercise in Values and Skills for Life and Career). The first session of the workshop was handled by Dr. D.Helen Christina. The speaker began her speech with associating the enchantments of a forest with the mysteries of life. She said that the forest could be both enchanting and dangerous. She compared adolescent life with the woods. She said one should have the mind set to admire the beauty of the forest that is the beauty of life. One should also learn to pass through the obstacles one has in life.

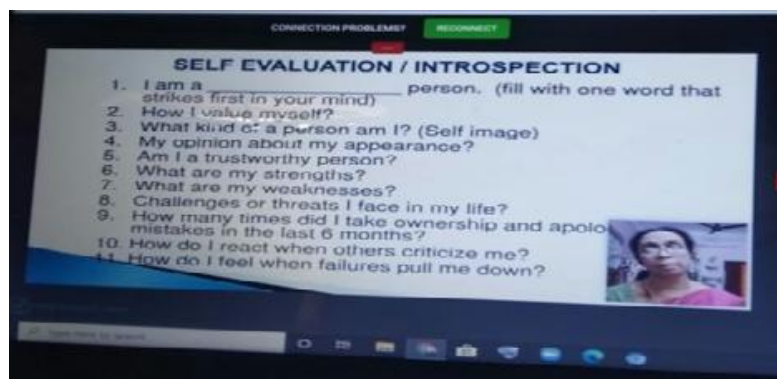
The speaker referred to World Health Organization’s recent announcement about the ten types of life skills. One should update these ten skills of life. Like in the woods, we should

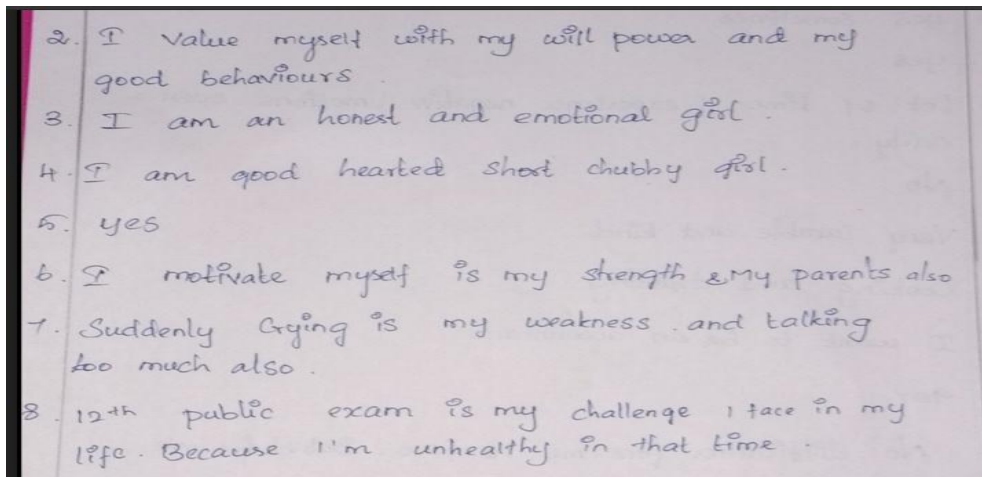


Self Evaluation Test given to Participants by Dr. Helen Christina

Prof. R. Raja Govindasamy, spearheaded the second half of the first day workshop. His session on Skill Set was made interesting and lively with brain games, opinion polls, witty quotes and humour.



Prof. R.Raja Govindasamy's Session on Skill Set

Prof. R.Raja Govindasamy started the session by citing the words of the American poet Robert Frost “Woods are Lovely”. With good will he greeted the participants and said life is a celebration – hence smile, appreciate good things in others and spread cheer all around.

On the onset, he remarked that Journey of life is akin to taking a walk in a bamboo forest. Accordingly to live better lives he proposed four functions of our life. Know thyself, understand others, accomplish things and also get things done. He assured the student participants that just like a shy caterpillar becomes a beautiful butterfly, all the sessions will help them to emerge from their doubts and fears as sprightly young aspirants.

The speaker started the session by referring to the monumental and historic event of man landing on the moon. It was Neil Armstrong who mustered courage, climbed down the ladder and stepped ahead to set foot on the unsure surface of the moon. With reference to this event he explained that a reversal of skill set is essential to cope with the cutthroat competition that prevails today.


The speaker then briefed on the real world skills and career skills. They are otherwise termed as ORTA skills. Observe, Read, Think and Act should be the mantra of life. The speaker then reckoned three obstacles - ignorance, indifference, inhibition which dampen the career skills of an individual. The speaker quoted the words of Dr. A.P.J. Abdul Kalam, former Indian President to indicate the value of team work.

Prof.R.Raja Govindasamy then referred to the words of Steve Jobs, former CEO of Apple, Inc., “Life is all about connecting the dots.” Being insightful will help one to realize one’s strengths and weaknesses. The session was made further interesting by giving brain games and self-evaluation tests. A poll was also conducted to ensure active participation of the students.

Then, the session moved on to the important theme “**Focusing onLife Skills**”. Her session was made interesting with stories and anecdotes and impressive videos.

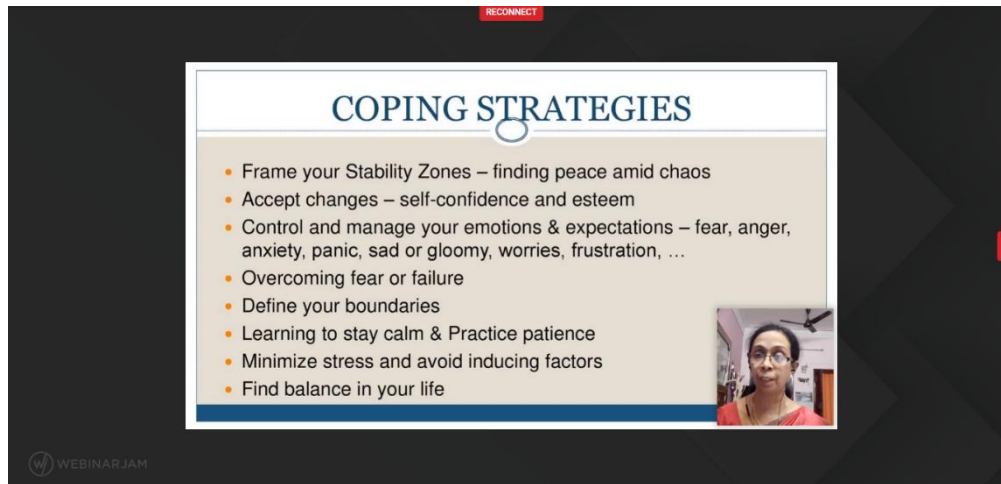

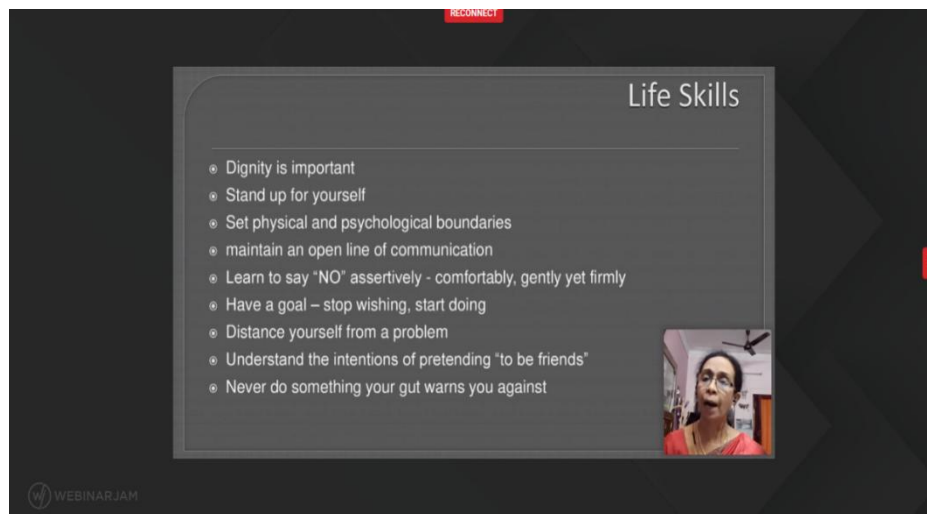

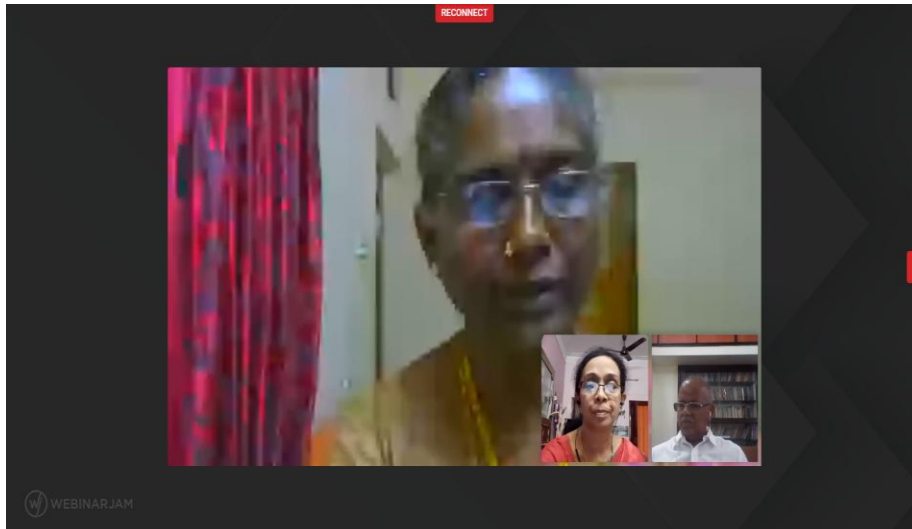
Dr. Helen spoke on the importance of Life Skills by quoting “Respect someone who really respects you”.



The Speaker’s focus on Life Skills

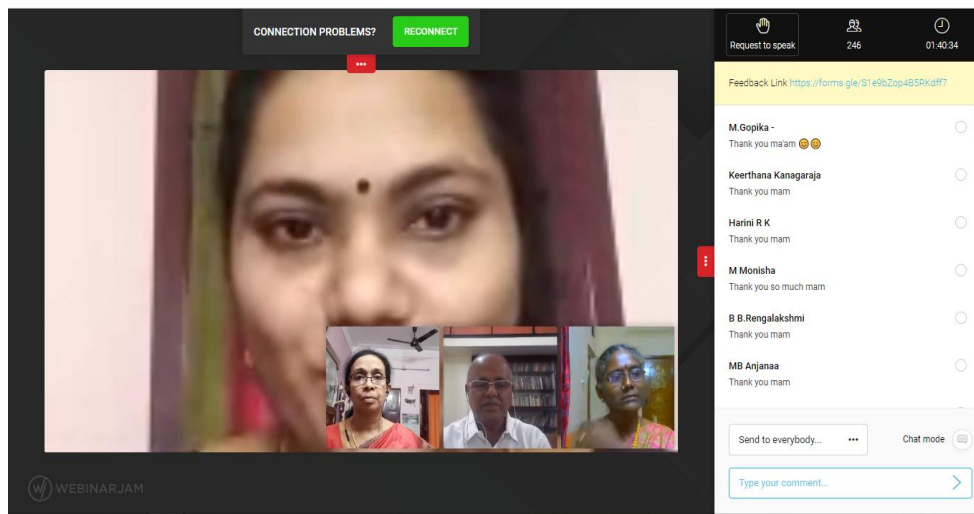

He quoted from swami Vivekananda, that in workplace you have to be soft as a flower and hard when demanding the job done; “only way to predict the future is the power to save the future”, he quoted to stress his point that every individual has the power to save the future and gave some 16 questions to the students for self evaluation.

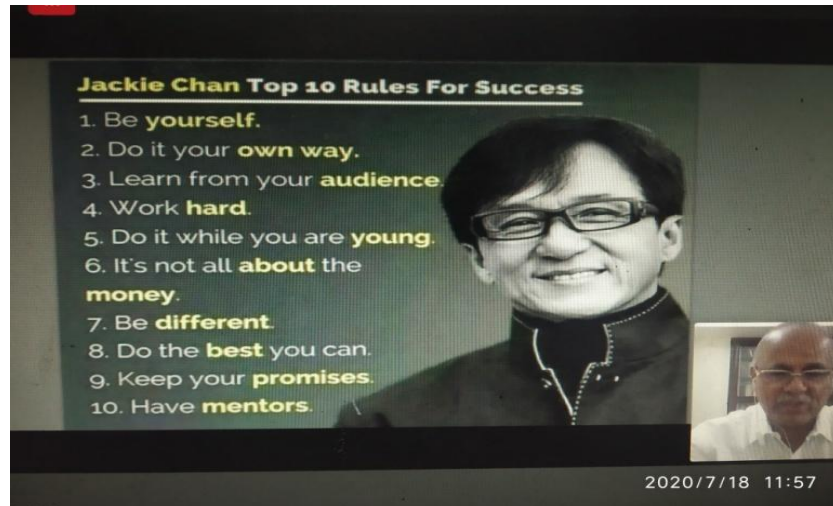

Discussion on activity assigned in Google Classroom

The Speaker facilitated the students to answer the question “Tell Me About Yourself”. He wanted the students to answer at their best with humility. He said that the skills needed for

creating an individual profile is leadership, planning and organizing, quality, persuasiveness, technical competence, problem solving, oral and written communication, commercial awareness, creativity and innovation, action orientation, strategic thinking, interpersonal sensitivity, flexibility, resilience, and personal motivation. He cited Indra Nooyi as an example for leadership. Regarding time management the chief speaker said “Put first things first”, as the best principle for personal management.

To illustrate his point further he cited Jackie Chan’s 10 rules for success,

He clarified the students that transferable skills are capability skills. Sir quoted Dr. Schuller;s book “Tough Times Never Last, but Tough People Do” and insisted the students to have this capability and suggested the students to take brain storming test for possible solutions. This is the simple technique to emerge from the woods. He advised the students to have elevated pitch for oral and written communications. Entrepreneurial skills involve commercial awareness, creativity and innovation, action orientation and strategic thinking.

Personal qualities comprise of interpersonal sensitivity, flexibility, resilience, and personal motivation. He concluded quoted Steve Jobs “Stay Hungry Stay Foolish”. To inspire the students the speaker of the occasion, played a video of Lenin an engineering graduate, turned parotta master. Success is not a fixed standard it is a journey of progress and after the self evaluation asked the students to emerge from the woods with flying colours. The program ended with a question answering session and Mrs. P.Sumedha, Head, Department of English (Shift II) proposed the vote of thanks. E-Certificates were distributed to all the participants who attended the Workshop on all the three days and submitted the assignments in Google Classroom.
