Webinar on National Education Policy 22.09.2020

In order to explain the salient features of the National Education policy, a webinar was jointly organized by *Unnat Bharat Abhiyan-2.0* and Reach out Society through Action (ROSA) of Fatima College, Madurai.

Sr. Vinnarasi, Coordinator of UBA and ROSA, Fatima College briefed the students on the ROSA programme. She explained the various activities done by the students with the help of their professors and the stakeholders in the adopted villages. Activities like computer literacy, cleaning of schools and villages, entrepreneur training, language teaching, kitchen gardening and much more have been performed in the villages. The students work whole heartedly with a service mind to uplift the people from rural areas. She proudly stated that the active contribution to the villages ensured Fatima College's presence in MHRD-UBA 2.0.

An introductory talk on NEP was given by Dr. M. Ragam, Coordinator (Shift I), NSS and Assistant Professor, Department of Physics, Fatima College. She started with the brief introduction to the four parts of the National Education Policy. 1. School 2. Higher Education; 3. Points to focus and 4. How to implement the policy. The National Education Policy was introduced in 2019 and is now in the next stage.

Dr S. R. Poongodi, Assistant Professor, Department of Tamil (Shift II) added on to the information provided on NEP.

Sr.Vinnarasi explained some of the challenges that come with the implementation of NEP. Since exams like NEET will be made mandatory for all sorts of higher education, many might not get the education they need she said. Schools in villages are in the danger to be transformed as adult education centres, this questions the famous saying of Gandhi who said

"India lives in its villages." The multiple entries and multiple exits approach will increase the number in college dropouts she said.

In the last session, the students expressed their ideas and opinions on NEP. The questions they raised were answered by Dr. M. Ragam and Dr. S. R. Poongodi promptly. Ms. Suga Priya, says, "National educational policy seems good if we just see from outside but when we go deep into it there are lots and lots of difficulty in this policy. Sudden implementation of this policy will affect village school students, definitely this policy will lead to many drop outs. There are lots of difficulties and in my point of view it will not work out." Ms. Priya says, "This session was very helpful to know the merits and demerits of NPE 2020. After our independence for the past 10years there is not much development in education sector, but after the establishment of NEP our educational level will be decreased. So as the citizens of India we should join and raise our voices against it."

The program ended at 2 pm with a vote of thanks delivered by Dr. Jesintha, Assistant Professor, The Research Centre of Tamil.





The IQAC of Fatima College arranged for a webinar for the students on National Education Policy 2020 on 6 November 2020 at 11.30 am. The guest speaker of the day was Dr. Karthikeyan, Dean and Controller of Examinations, Vivekananda College, Madurai. The sessions began with Dr. Mary Magdalene Introducing the Chief Guest and welcoming the audience in the virtual platform. The speaker began his speech by focusing on the new system that is brought in the education sector. He highlighted the transformation from CBCS way of teaching to OBE Pattern.




