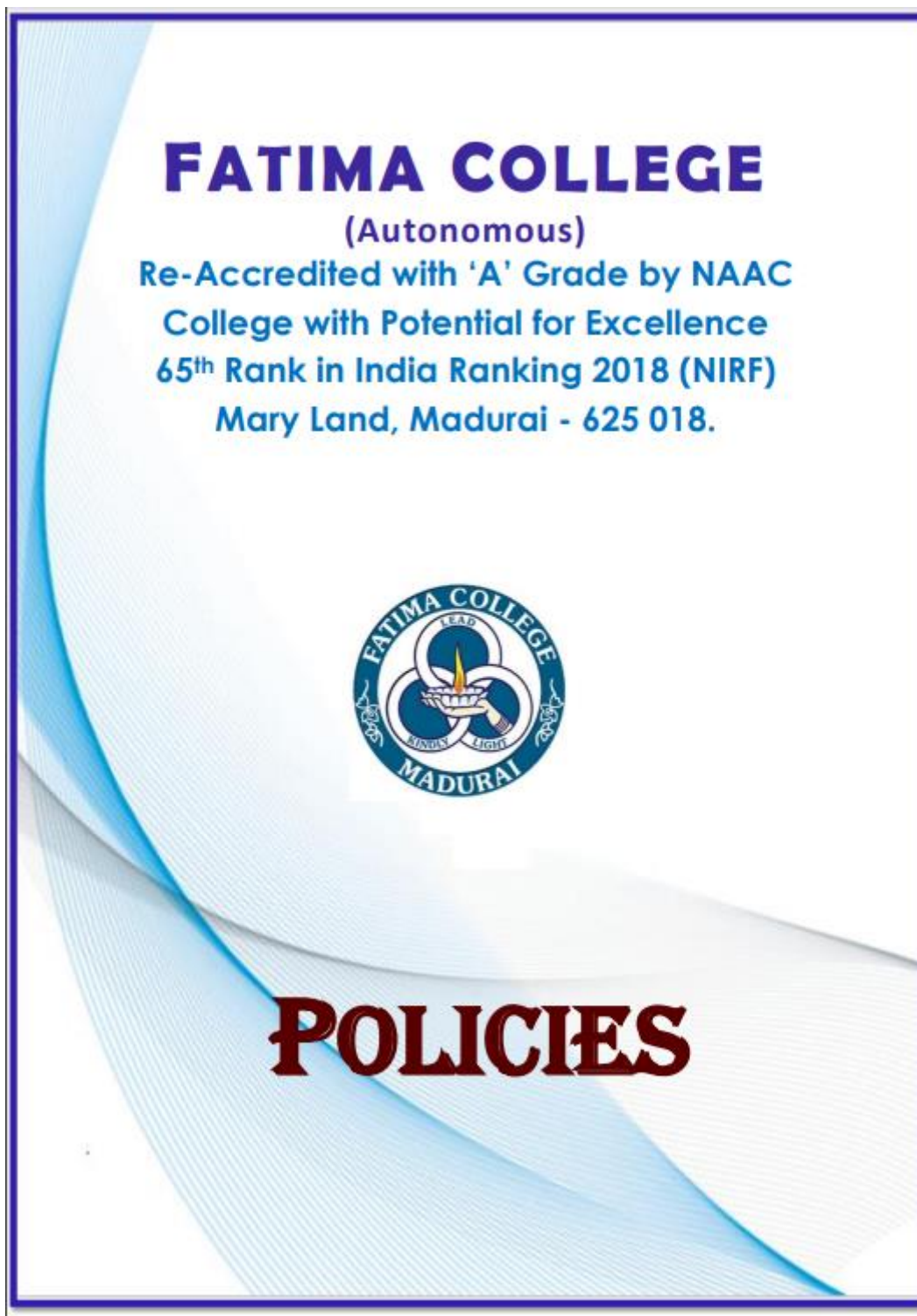

2.3. SOLID & LIQUID WASTE MANAGEMENT

The Solid waste management is taken care at the root level. The segregation of the dry and wet wastes is done. The students are made to deposit waste in colored bins labelled as dry and wet wastes. Further segregation if needed will be done by the sub staff.

The dry wastes will be accumulated in the vermicomposting pit. The wet waste is used as manure for plants or sent to the bio digester of the biogas plant.

The sanitary napkins are put in incinerators approved by the corporation and the smoke chimney is fixed at the stipulated height. Electric incinerators are installed in the wash rooms of the students and the staff.

The Liquid waste management will be in full capacity by the year 2023. As of now the output of the RO plant is accumulated in a tank and used for gardening.

REPORT ON VERMICOMPOST

Vermicompost has been emerging as an important source in supplementing and substituting chemical fertilizers in agriculture. Vermicompost, also known as 'farmers' friend' is used for general crops and plantation crops. It is a valuable input for sustainable agriculture and wasteland development. It is a growth promoter and helpful in providing hormones required for plant growth. By understanding its importance Fatima College, Green Club started to make Vermicompost by decomposable organic waste such as kitchen waste, animal dung, farm residues and leaf litters are commonly used as composting materials. In the pits red earthworm (*Eisenia foetida*) preferred species of earthworms were used to convert the organic matter into vermicompost within 45-50 days. Green Club volunteers regularly watered the pits and filled the pits and took great care of the composing pits. Finally, the outcome of finished product received was 3/4th of the raw materials used. At last, the compost was separated, sieved, well packed and sold in the college campus with the help of student volunteers.

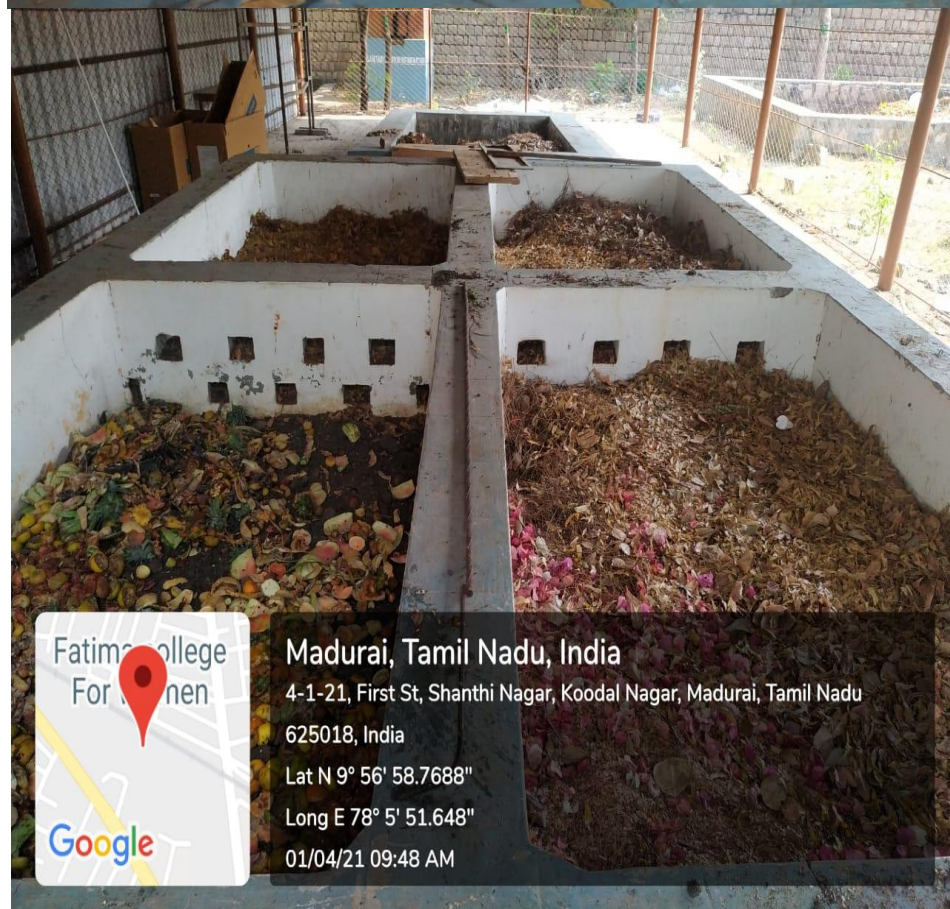

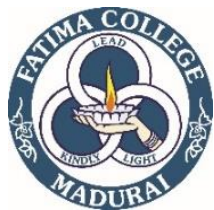

Thiru BBC Naveen Kumar, Chief Program Coordinator, MGNCRE initiated his talk with economic progress of India in the fields of information technology, infrastructure and services. He said that the primary sector (Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries) that accounts for over 68% of the population has been lagging behind with an average annual growth of 4% per annum or less that generates lot of disparity between rural and urban livelihoods. He insisted that, there is an urgent need to accelerate the diversification of rural livelihoods so that rural communities have adequate means and opportunities which are viable and sustainable. He suggested that Rural Entrepreneurship can address this issue and generate self-employment through pooling of community resources.
