ROSA is the flagship for Extension activities of Fatima College. Initiated in 2006-2007 ROSA aims at providing opportunities for experiential education for the students, enabling them to apply the knowledge they acquire in classrooms for the benefit of the neighbourhood community. It is in line with the College Vision: "...to empower women by developing human capabilities through quality education ...making them responsible citizens who can work for the advancement of the society..."

Extension activity is designed as an **off-campus program with 3 credits** for the Final year students. It has a general objective of the upliftment of the underprivileged, reaching out to the unreachable, caring for the education and health of rural children, revitalizing the self-confidence of young women and making them financially independent by providing them entrepreneurship skills.

Unnat Bharat Abhiyan is a flagship programme of the Ministry of Human Resource Development with the intention to enrich Rural India. Fatima College is one of the **Participating Institution** selected in a challenge mode based on our contribution to societal development.

As per requirement, our institution has identified 5 villages namely ThirumalNatham, Nedungulam, Vadugapatti, Ambalathadi and Kondayampatti, in consultation with the District Collector and have built good rapport with people. So far the college has conducted **Participatory**Rural Appraisal and formed Stakeholders committee in each village.

Village survey and house hold survey has been carried out. The students have actively participated in identifying natural and human resources available in each village with the view to match those resources with the actual needs of the local people.

Summer internship programme was organized in Kondaympatti village and addressed to the education, health and environmental issues of the village. The faculty and students participated in **Gram Sabha** meeting on August 15th in all the UBA villages and identified key problems to be addressed.

WEBINAR ON NATIONAL EDUCATION POLICY 22.09.2020

Activities like computer literacy, cleaning of schools and villages, entrepreneur training, language teaching, kitchen gardening and much more have been performed in the villages. Sr.Vinnarasi explained some of the challenges that come with the implementation of NEP. 
