MOOCs on SWAYAM ('Study Webs of Active Learning for Young Aspiring Minds'):

SWAYAM is an indigenous platform of the Government of India which hosts MOOCs(Massive Open Online Course) course to enable students to virtually attend the courses taught by the best faculty. It provides access to high quality reading resources, enables to participate in discussion forums, to take up test and earn academic grades. The UGC has issued UGC(Credit Framework for Online Learning Courses through SWAYAM) Regulation, 2016 – for the credit transfer of MOOCs courses.

- SWAYAM course is a 12-15 weeks structured course comprising of video lecture, Reading material(that can be downloaded/printed), self-assessment test and online discussion forum.
- Students can enroll for MOOCs on June and November every year
- Learner can earn certificate/credit on successful completion of course on SWAYAM
- MOOCs can be offered as Extra Credit or it can offered as part of the curricula to facilitate blended method of Teaching methodology.
- Once the learner acquires the credit, it can be entered in the cumulative marksheet.

She started her session deliberating on the effectiveness of the teacher in terms of personal, professional and interpersonal qualities. Dr. J. Asnet Mary encouraged the fellow teachers to transform from ordinary to extraordinary teachers. She beautifully connected the effectiveness of teaching to two important concepts such as Pendulum principle and Effectiveness Equation. She further highlighted on Aristotle's statement "Excellence is not an act, but a habit" to bring out the constructive changes in the methods and strategies of teaching. Her metaphor of comparing this change with the right amount of different qualitative ingredients to yield a quality product was so thought provoking. Her in-depth deliberations on the difference between proactive and reactive persons were really useful and teachers were asked to selfexamine themselves on these terms. Her most engaging session was on the topic "Begin with the End in Mind". After which, teachers were asked to write their own mission statements as an individual and as a teacher. Her interesting motivational songs were the highlights of the session. The session ended with her personal miraculous story of the completion of Ph.D, followed by an activity named "Human Knot" insisting on the team spirit needed to achieve common goals of the institution.

She started her session by quoting a line from Kothari Commission that destiny of India is shaped in the classroom insisting on the significance of curriculum development in Higher Education. Her detailed deliberations on the current OBE pattern and mapping of vision and mission of the college with Program Educational Objectives (PEOs), Program Outcomes (POs) and Course Outcomes (Cos) were really productive and gave a clear- cut idea of how a higher education would design its curriculum. She also briefly explained about the Board of Studies and its role in designing and revision of curriculum in Fatima College. She laid emphasis on how curriculum designed in the college matches with graduate attributes. Further, she vividly explicated

Session: 1 Research Ethics and Funding Agencies.


The resource person for this session was Dr. Vasantha Esther Rani, Associated Professor and Head, The Research center of Home Science, Fatima College, Madurai. Mrs. B. Usha, Assistant Professor of MCA introduced the Chief Guest.

The Chief Guest started the session with an introduction to research a formalized curiosity. She explained about pre-research and stage in preresearch. She gave detailed description about the stages of pre-research. Then she shared some tips for selecting a topic. After that, she discussed about Research ethics quoting that Research ethics are the application of fundamental ethical principles to research activities including the design and implementation of research. Research ethics are set of rules of our own and others behavior. She explained about the research ethics committee. Institutional Review Board reviews whether the research is ethical enough or not to protect the rights dignity and welfare of the respondents. Then she discussed about the five broad categories of research ethics namely, minimizing the risk of harm next, minimizing the risk of the research, obtaining informed consent, protecting anonymity and confidentiality and to avoid misleading practices. She also explained about the advantages of research ethics like how research ethics promotes the aim of the research. Also she explained about the limitations of research ethics. She discussed about ensuring ethics at every step of research. Then she gave us the list of various funding agencies. She gave us few tips to reduce stress level during research. She motivated us saying if the research is rejected try again. She concluded the session by sharing her personal experiences in research. Vote of thanks was delivered by Mrs. B. Usha, Assistance Professor of MCA, Fatima College, Madurai.

Meena, Assistant Professor, MBA welcomed the audience and introduced the chief guest Dr. Alex, Associate Professor, Department of Commerce, St. Joseph's College (Autonomous) and briefed some of his academic achievements, highlighting his expertise in training the teachers and entrepreneurs.

The floor was then open to the Guest Speaker to address the audience who began quoting Swami Vivekananda, "You are what you are in darkness." Dr. K. Alex informed the teachers to know the importance of the place of work. He also went on to distinguish expression and communication and explained that the former is words spoken with feelings whereas the latter is words spoken without expression.
