The following facts are placed on record :

### CHANGES :

1. Fatima College has introduced Choice Based Credit System for all U.G. Courses from the academic year 2001-2002.



2. Language Study (Tamil/Hindi/French) is introduced for B.Com. (Regular)

3. Part II - General English is introduced for B.B.A. learning the need for communicative skills.

4.a) From this academic year I B.Com. (Regular) students are also streamlined for Part II English and will do regular Part II English Course offered to the rest of the degree students.

b) Department of English has offered graded material of three levels to meet the needs of the students. For the I and II level, the members of the department have released a text book bearing the title 'Getting Ahead'. For both Internal (CIA) and End Semester Examinations, three different levels of question papers are used for evaluation.

The students are streamlined on the basis of their performance in an attainment test on entry and are offered the following three courses.

'A' Stream - Communication Skills - Basic.

'B' Stream - " " - Intermediate.

'C' Stream - " " - Advanced.

5. Project work is introduced in all majors for V or VI Semester either as compulsory subject or as an optional.

6. Comprehensive Viva will be introduced in a few majors.

7. AICTE has given approval for 60 seats for MCA from 2001.

8. B.A. Economics is now termed as B.B.E. and M.A. Economics is renamed as M.B.E.

9. Examination Reforms:

i) 'The Objective-type questions' is being added as one of the Components of End Semester examination question pattern and

this forms  $\frac{1}{4}$ th of the total marks. However General English and language papers do not fall under this category.

ii) Objective-type questions must be answered in the first half-an-hour, in the question paper itself and the same will be collected by the Invigilator at the stipulated time, to maintain integrity and avoid malpractice.

iii) It is suggested that the End Semester Question paper must be set by the external examiner for Major & Ancillary papers for all the 3 years of study and the same holds good for End Semester Practicals too.

iv) From this academic year I Degree Course students will appear for Semester Exam for Part I (Language) & Part II (Gen. Eng.), instead of year end exam.

#### Exceptions:

I.Dc B.Com. - Language - End Sem. exam only at the end of the year.

Comp. Science - Language & Gen. Eng. - End Sem. exam only at the end of the year.

10. External maximum for all papers  $\rightarrow 100$ .

11. Fatima College has become an associate of Anna University to provide advanced professional training in Computer Education for the students and the examination will be conducted by Anna University.

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Academic Council - Report. 28.09.2001.

The Academic Council meeting started at 10 A.M. with prayer by Sr. Lilly Kully (V.P.). Principal, Sr. Ignatius Mary welcomed the gathering. (This is the first Academic Council meeting after her becoming the Principal.) Following the welcome by the new Principal, Mrs. K. Mary Jacintha, Dean of Academic Affairs presented the changes made in various academic matters, which led to the following discussion.

1. IDCK made clarifications regarding the change of nomenclature of B.A. & M.A. Economics into B.B.E. and M.B.E. He asked whether all formalities have been complied with in the change. The Principal replied that the change has been approved by Madurai Kamaraj University and the written communication in this regard has already been received by the College.

The University nominee suggested that when such changes are made the interest of the students must be protected. She felt that the P.G. students may face problems while appearing for SLET and joining the M.Phil. degree course because of the change in the nomenclature.

2. IDCK made another clarification regarding the Objective questions in the End Semester. He asked whether the  $\frac{1}{2}$  an hour time allotted is the first  $\frac{1}{2}$  an hour of the exam or the 1st  $\frac{1}{2}$  an hour of the students' entrance into the exam hall.



The Principal replied that definitely it is the first  $\frac{1}{2}$  an hour of the latter. However, she added that this problem will not arise in Fatima College, as all the students come on time for the exam.

3. There was a lot of discussion on CBCS. JDCE and University nominee unanimously felt that CBCS is a welcome change. Yet they felt the need to clarify various points in this regard. They insisted that the students should be given the real choice in the selection of papers to earn extra credits.

University nominee questioned whether the student who earns extra credits in the I year will be allowed to avoid any elective in the II year.

At this juncture Dr. (Mrs.) B. Shyamala and Dr. (Mrs.) Chellam Ramakrishnan gave a brief explanation on CBCS in Fatima College. They said that this is the I year of introduction of CBCS and students are to be oriented in this regard a lot. As such at present there is no provision to earn extra credits in the I year. But however they can earn extra credits when they come to the III year.

Mrs. Amalarpavamary, department of Mathematics, Fatima College expressed her view stating that if self-study is awarded extra credit, the mode of evaluation is to be fixed. She also said that the individual department should be given autonomy in fixing the credits and project is not feasible at UG level.

Dr. (Miss) Mahima asked the invitees whether certificate courses can be counted as extra credits. The University nominee did not seem to have faith in self-study and dismissed the idea of getting extra credits from outside. She said that the number of credits must be on par with the number of hours allotted for each paper. For example, if a student attending Sociology class for 2 hrs. is to be given 2 credits, the same student may do 6 hrs. of Mathematics and be given 6 credits.

Dr. (Mrs.) M.A. Suleila explained the way of approach

of Fatima College (which bears resemblance to that of Loyola college and Holy Cross, Trichy) with regard to CBCS. There are miles to go in this regard and in future the syllabi will expand based on the options offered, keeping in mind the welfare of the student community.

4. H.O.Ds presented a brief note of the minutes of Board of Studies meeting held in May/June 2001 and the syllabi.

IDCE raised questions regarding the following syllabi and the same were clarified by the concerned H.O.Ds.

(i) General English

(ii) Commerce - Banking Law & Accounts.

At the end of the meeting Mrs. A.T. Auxilia Felicitas Dean of Academic Affairs proposed the Vote of Thanks.

The Chairperson of the Academic Council and the Principal, Dr. Sr. G. Celine Sahaya Mary welcomed the gathering, introduced the new members of the Academic Council and highlighted on the significant academic ventures on campus.

Dr. Sr. G. Celine Sahaya Mary invited Dr. M. Meenakumari, Dean of Academic Affairs (Arts) to Present the resolutions of the Curriculum Development Cell Meetings to be approved in the Council. She Presented its minutes and resolutions as follows :

The Meeting of the Curriculum Development Cell (CDC) was held in SJ5 at 11.00 a.m on August 03, 2023. The following were resolved in the Curriculum Development Cell Meeting :

Based on the Communication received from Registrar (i/c), Madurai Kamaraj University letter no - MKU/R/TANSCH/2022 dtd: 13/12/2022, TANSCH Guidelines for UG and PG Degree, Dr. Sr. Celine Sahaya Mary, the Chairperson of the Curriculum Development Cell initiated discussions on the revamping of the Syllabus as Proposed by the Tamil Nadu State Council for Higher Education (TANSCH) for the academic year 2023-2024 (IUG and I PG batch).

The Honorable Minister for Higher Education, Dr. K. Ponmudy on 02/08/2023 Convened a



Meeting for the Principals of Autonomous Colleges.  
As a result of which, it was decided in  
the Curriculum Development Cell of Fatima College  
that it will ONLY follow the Core Courses  
given in the TANSICHE Model Syllabus with  
the Permitted 25 Percent autonomy and will  
follow its own syllabus under Part-I, Part-II,  
Part-III (Electives), Part-IV and Part-V.

Dr. M. Meenakumari, Head, Department of Sociology and Social Work brought to the notice of Academic Council, that in the Board of Studies Meeting held on April 05, 2023 at 2.00 P.m for B.A. Sociology with Computer Applications, it has been resolved to change the nomenclature of the UG Programme as B.A. Sociology instead of B.A. Sociology with Computer Applications, to avoid equivalency Problems Considering the interests of the Students who would take Jobs in Government Service. It has been resolved that the Programme would be offered as B.A. Sociology from the forthcoming academic year 2024-2025.

At the end of all the Presentations by the Chairpersons of the different Board of Studies, the University Nominees and the External Experts Placed on record the following Commendations and



## Recommendations

### Commendations and Recommendations:

- The Systematic and meticulous organisation of the Academic Council Meeting and the efforts taken by the Staff members were appreciated by Prof. A. Joseph Dorairaj, Professor of English and Dean, School of English and Foreign Languages, Gandhigram Rural Institute. He also added that the Academic Council Meeting is a mammoth exercise, which the Staff members have done it well.
- Sr. Amala appreciated the systematic and meticulous way of the organization and applauded the Presentation done in an organized manner.
- Mr. Raja Rajeswaran, Auditor, External member, appreciated all the efforts taken by the College both in maintaining quality in academics and in maintaining discipline. He Proposed that he will
  - help the Students in the field of accounting and share his expertise in the arena of updated accounting to the Students.
  - help the institution in getting new employment opportunities in the field of Management and Accounting available for the Students
- Dr. Asokan, Professor, Department of Mathematics, School of Mathematics, Madurai Kamaraj University, asked the internal and external ratio. He also asked about the Conduct of Retest for absentees. Dr. Meenakumari, Dean of Arts Clarified that the internal and external ratio is 40:60 and also told that there is a Provision for Retest.
  - Dr. Asokan enquired about the non-Scholastic



Components and focused on the Percentage of marks for attendance. Dr. S.J. Kala, Dean of Research answered that the students having 80 Percent of attendance will be given full marks of 5 and it also includes class Participation.

- Dr. T. Jebasingh, Assistant Professor, Department of Plant Science, School of Biological Science, Madurai Kamaraj University, asked about the CIA Components and the reason for conduct of 2 internal tests. He also added that for 2023 batch in TANSCHIE it was given 3 tests. Dr. Meenakumari, explained as per the autonomy given by TANSCHIE, the evaluation pattern and the mark distribution are decided in the CDC of Fatima College.

- Dr. T. Jebasingh questioned the revision of MCA Courses with more than 25 Percent as given by TANSCHIE. Mrs. S. Mary Helen Felista, Chairman of MCA responded that for MCA, the regulations of AICTE is followed in the Institution.

- Dr. T. Jebasingh enquired about the title of the Lab Course Human Physiology and Environmental Biology in the III Semester. Dr. Mrs. Antony Amala Jeyaseeli, Chairperson of Zoology responded that Human Physiology and Environmental Biology is offered as Core Courses Separately, so for Practical knowledge both the Courses were integrated and given as Lab Course.

- Dr. T. Jebasingh suggested to have Value Added Course to be Discipline Specific

- Prof. A. Joseph Dorairaj, enquired about the Pattern of questions and the distribution of marks for UG and PG. Dr. S.J. Kala answered the Pattern followed in the College.

Prof. A. Joseph Dorairaj suggested to give



more Seminars. He also asked for the rationale for inclusion of PG Comprehensive Viva in add on credits. Dr. Meenakumari, answered that the Comprehensive Viva is not included under TANSICHE mandated credits, so that it is offered in the add on credits. He recommended

- to change the add on credits course Cyber Security offered to UG and PG as "Basics of Cyber Security" for UG and "Advanced Course on Cyber Security" for PG.
  - to incorporate the front Page of the Programme and also suggested to mention the deletion and introduction of new Courses in each Semester. As it will give a thorough knowledge to the external about the Courses offered Semester wise
  - to invite Subject experts from Premier Institutes like NIT, IIT, and importance should be given to experts outside Tamil Nadu.
- He also added that experts with research experience should be invited for evaluation of Project work

- Sr. Amala, suggested Subject experts should be called from outside the State, so that the College can exchange the knowledge of expertise and move to the next level.

As a response to the Commendations and Suggestions, the Chairperson of the Academic Council, Dr. Sr. Celine Sahaya Mary thanked the University Nominees and the external experts and assured that the Suggestions will be carried out in the forthcoming Academic year.
