REPORT

Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC), Fatima College (Autonomous), organized the Faculty Induction Programme (FIP) for the newly appointed staff for four days from 28.08.2023 to 31.08.2023 in the venue A2, from 10:30 am to 12:30 pm. On the whole 37 staff members from aided and self-financing attended the session on Day-1.

HIGHLIGHTS

The first day of the event started with an Inaugural session. The inauguration was started with a holy prayer, followed by the welcome address by Dr. R. Saktheswari, IQAC Assistant Coordinator, & Assistant Professor of English. Dr. E. Helena, IQAC Assistant Coordinator, & Assistant Professor of Mathematics, introduced the purpose and the preamble of the four-day FIP to the audience.

Day 1 - 28.08.2023

Rev. Dr. Sr. M. Francisca Flora, Secretary, Fatima College (Autonomous) was the Resource person for Day-1, and she delivered the content on "Culture of Fatima College – Make a Difference". Sister started with the vision and mission of the institution, and clearly detailed the vision statement. She presented about the history of the college and about founders and pioneers of the institution. The Secretary Sister addressed about the selection



policy & procedures, rules, regulations, employment conditions, and the disciplinary measures to the new staff team. She highlighted the qualities of a good teacher and ended up her address by congratulating the staff team.

A photo session was arranged with the Secretary, Principal, IQAC Coordinators and the new staff team. The new staff members introduced themselves and the event ended up with vote of thanks by Dr. L. Meena, Member of IQAC, & Assistant Professor of Management Studies.





Report - Day 2 (28.08.2023)

Session 1:

Day 2 commenced with the session titled, "Power Within You" by Dr. Sr. G. Jenita Rani, Vice Principal (Shift II). Sister drew a striking analogy between teachers and eagles and pointed out that the teachers need to aim high and have a focused vision like that of the eagles. It was stressed that the teachers learn lessons from their mistakes and do not dwell in their past in order to surge ahead. The way eagles train the young ones was beautifully expounded by Sister by which she stressed upon the significance of being strict with the students. It was also indicated that the quality of the students highly depend on the quality of their teachers. Hence, as the eagle renews itself after forty years by plucking out the talons and old feathers, so must the teachers also renew and update their knowledge to ensure excellence.



Session 2:

Dr. M. Meenakumari, Dean of Arts, Associate Professor, Department of Sociology spoke on "Strategies of Curriculum Development and Evaluation Methods" which was the final session of Day 2. The session elaborated the Fatima Model Curriculum (Choice Based Credit System) and Evaluation. Ample light was thrown on the Programme Outcomes (PO), Programme Specific Outcomes (PSO) that are integral in understanding the essential strategies of curriculum development as per the Revised Blooms Taxonomy. The method to frame a syllabus and set various 'k' levels were also highlighted. Dr. Meenakumari also spoke on how important the thought process of an educator is. It was suggested that the thoughts, words and deeds are things that a person is accountable for and hence must be watchful.



Day 3 (30.08.2023)

Session 1:

The very first session on Day 3 was "Research Integrated Teaching: A Need of the Hour", addressed by Dr. S.J. Kala, Dean of Research and Associate Professor of English, The Research Centre of English, Fatima College. Dr. Kala emphasized the need for preparedness of a teacher in a classroom and the role of research in teaching and evaluation. By integrating new, innovative and Transformative Teaching Pedagogy into academic practice, teachers can enhance their teaching excellence, create a supportive learning environment, and inspire students to reach their full potential. In this inspiring session, teachers were encouraged to adopt a teaching method that incorporates research projects into the curriculum that will further orient the students to participate in such research. It can help to create a dynamic learning environment where students can develop their analytical skills and contribute to academic knowledge. Dr. Kala also stressed the importance of effective communication as one of the qualities of a good teacher.



Session 2:

The day's second session titled "Body Language and Presentation Skills" was delivered by Dr. S. Saira Banu, Associate Professor, The Research Centre of English, Fatima College. According to Dr. Saira, a teacher should not just be an instructor but also needs to be an entertainer. This session focused also on how a teacher needs to be presentable in the college campus by the way she dresses and behaves. A teacher needs to change her teaching methodology according to the need of the class and more than trying to complete the syllabus must be bent upon shaping the student holistically. A teacher is also expected to handle the class with a tinge of humour if need be, to gauge the attention of a disinterested class. Thus, instead of teaching based on a set of rules, the teacher must have the presence of mind to tailor her teaching according to the changing mentality of the students. Dr. S. Saira Banu elaborated on how to become the best teacher with a blend of all these approaches and she emphasized how a teacher should become the best of all by adopting an eclectic approach.



Day 4 (31.08.2023)

Session 1:

The first session on Day four was on "Lateral Thinking for Effective Teaching" by Dr. K. Rosemary Euphrasia, IQAC Coordinator and Associate Professor of Computer Science which highlighted on the three modes of thinking: convergent, divergent, and lateral. The session stressed the significance of lateral and divergent thinking in contemporary contexts. Through a series of interactive activities, participants were kept engaged and encouraged to apply these modes of thinking in real-world scenarios, promoting cognitive flexibility, rational thinking and creative problem-solving. The audience was also familiarized with the Six Thinking Hats that depict various approaches to solve a problem. Such methods need also to be utilized in classrooms to improve the efficient response skills of the students. By emphasizing the importance of diverse thinking approaches, the session aimed to enhance overall out-of-the-box thinking abilities and foster a more original mindset.



Session 2:

Dr. S. Vidya, Associate Professor of Computer Science handled the second session on "Teacher's Quality: Prepare to Perform". It focused on the significance of National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) and Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) in promoting institutional excellence. Dr. Vidya highlighted the key features of NAAC. The speaker insisted the teachers to adopt innovative teaching methods, publish research papers, mentor students, participate in workshops and conferences, collaborate with industry partners, and focus on student employability and academic performance. Dr. Vidya also reminded the importance of Annual Quality Assurance Report (AQAR) that needs to be prepared with precision. Further she said, teachers should familiarize themselves with NAAC and NIRF parameters, work collaboratively with IQAC, and strive to maintain a high level of professionalism, cultural sensitivity, and punctuality. By implementing these strategies, teachers can enhance their institution's reputation, improve student outcomes and contribute to the growth of a knowledge-based society.




