

Those wishing to present papers at the conference should send an abstract of the paper to english@ldc.edu.in. The abstract should reach the organizers on or before 20 February 2019. Participants will be intimated of the selection of abstracts by 23 February 2019.

The abstract should be 250 words or less and should be based on any of the thrust areas mentioned under Call for Papers or on related areas. Only selected abstracts will be published in the conference booklet.

Full papers, not exceeding 1500 words in length following the MLA (8" edition) guidelines, should reach the organizers by 28 February 2019. The selected papers will be subjected to scrutiny for plagiarism.

Those willing to participate without paper presentation should also register and pay the registration fee.

Participants requiring accommodation should contact the organizers. This can be arranged on separate payment on a first-come-first-served basis.

No TA/DA will be given to the participants.
