



Session on Codependency Date: 08-09-2016

I UG − 50 members of Women's Cell assembled in the San Jose Seminar Hall and the session began with a wrapping of last week's group discussion. A sand animation dedicated to Nirbhaya was screened. This was followed by the screening of a short film that speculates the age old adage "Boys don't cry" as the major cause of all crimes against women today.

Having spent the last few weeks reflecting on serious concerns like rape, the faculty members thought it was about time to introduce the young minds to passive issues against women in the patriarchal society. While it is beyond question that violence against women needs our immediate and effective attention, it is equally true that smaller, less noticeable biases desperately need our attention and understanding too.

One such issue is codependency. Most Indian women, at least those of the previous generation, are codependent, as in they have moved from selflessness towards self-sacrifice, to the point that they have lost their identity for the welfare of their families. Women's cell members were introduced to this psychological issue using a video and a survey questionnaire.

Then the gathering proceeded to explore the causes of such willingness to give up oneself for the sake of others. Students suggested how low self-worth is a cause. They further raised points about how upbringing and beauty consciousness pose vital hurdles in the way of feminist goals. Along these lines, videos from the campaigns of brands like Dove (Real Beauty), Myntra (Change is Beautiful) and Vogue (Bold is Beautiful) were played.

The following ideas were put forth by the videos screened in this session:

- Beauty is a mindset.
- As such we are all more beautiful than we think.
- Causing a change does not always need a rebellion.
- But sometimes, when it is needed, just standing up for oneself is sufficient.

OUTCOME:

This session was useful in shaping young minds about the true goals of feminism, which is not just women's safety but women's total liberation.
