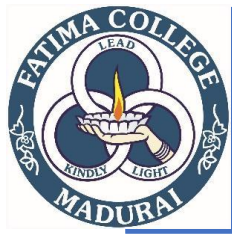

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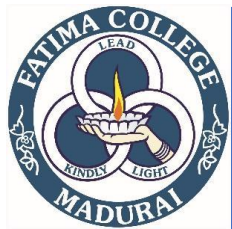
Day I - June 21, 2017

BLOOD DONATION CAMP AT FATIMA COLLEGE

The camp was held in the presence of Dr. Pratheepan and his team members. More than 90 students enthusiastically volunteered for blood donation and 49 students were qualified for blood donation and two staff members were also volunteered.

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VETERINARY CAMP AT KONDAYAMPATTI

The events of the day began with a prayer. Dr. Vinosha, Assistant Professor, Department of Chemistry, NSS Coordinator enlightened the students on the significance of the various activities planned for the next three days in the adopted villages Kondayampatti, T. Andipatti and Thanichiyam. Apart from the regular activities, the conduct of the Veterinary Camp is a special feature. The domestic animals are a special asset to the inhabitants of the villages in India. These animals find an exclusive place in their homes and they are well taken care of, as they play a vital role in the economic growth of the families. Dr Valliappan, Veterinary Physician, Pirani Mithran Hospital, Madurai diagnosed the animals like goats, cows, hens and dogs. Some of the animals were administered with deworming-medicines and others were given general health check-ups. The doctor instructed the owners to maintain the good health of animals through regular check-ups and by feeding healthy food. The physician also instructed the owners about the preventive measures taken for animals at times of unexpected injury or accidents. The appreciable part of the Veterinary camp was the distribution of free tablets, syrup and anti-septic solutions.

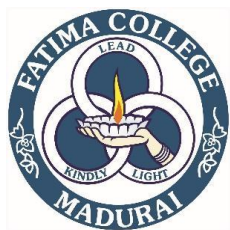
Another aspect of this Camp was the awareness programme on 'First Aid for Animal Bite'. The doctor advised the students to give immediate attention for the victim of dog bite. The simple process of washing the wound in running water and by applying anti-septic cream will not protect the victim from deep poisoning of the blood. Overall, the Camp was a great success.

MEDICAL CAMP AT KONDAYAMPATTI

Organizing a Medical Camp is a regular feature in all the NSS Units. The experienced doctors of Leonard Multi Specialty Hospital, Batlagundu collaborated with NSS Units in the effective conduct of the medical camp. Dr Partheepan of Leonard Hospital conducted the general health checkup for the villagers of all age groups.

One of the irreparable problems that India faces even now is the difficulty in rendering proper and sustained health services to the rural and the under-privileged people. With the humble attempt to meet this need, the NSS Unit of Fatima College organized the medical camp to provide little medical services to the people residing in villages. General Health medicines were distributed to the deserving people. Other essential items like cough syrup, Paracetamol tablets and tablets for general ailments were given to those who visited the camp. Apart from the distribution of medicines, counseling was given to the people to maintain good health.

On the whole, the camp provided comprehensive medical help at free of cost. On the other hand, the camp was an eye-opener to the NSS volunteers who willingly came forward to help the needy and showed enthusiasm to learn simple preventive measures for certain diseases and ailments.



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Medical Camp at Kondayampatti

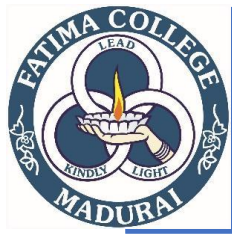


RALLY

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LITERARY COMPETITIONS FOR THE STUDENTS AT KONDAYAMPATTI PANCHAYAT SCHOOL

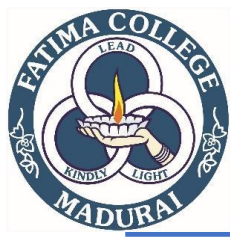

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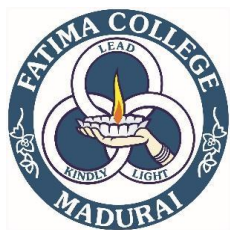

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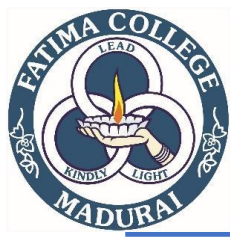


LITERARY COMPETITIONS FOR THE SCHOOL STUDENTS IN THANICHIYAAM

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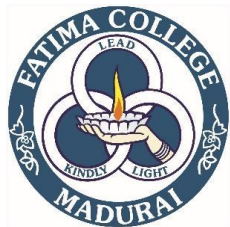
Literary Competitions conducted for College Students

NSS students participated in a mini marathon covering 7 km in commemoration of the Birth centenary celebration of Dr.MGR and all the participants completed the task.





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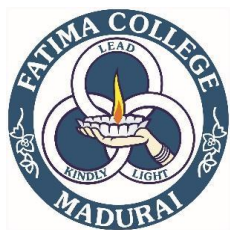
