FREE LEGAL AID SERVICES AND WOMEN'S RIGHTS

Free Legal Aid Services and Women's Rights

Human Rights Cell of Fatima College in Collaboration with Madurai District Legal Services Authority organised one-day awareness campaign on Free Legal Aid Services and Women's Rights. The session was taken over by Secretary Sub-judge of District Legal Services Authority, Mr. T. Panneer Selvam and Senior Panel Advocate, Mr. P. Uma Shankar.

Mr. T. Panneer Selvam highlighted the importance of laws to maintain a rational society. He said that the common sense ideals that are sanctioned by the government turn into laws.

He said that laws are applicable right from the birth of a child and extends even after the death. Prenatal determination of the sex of a baby is a punishable offense, even the use of symbols or actions to convey whether the baby is a male or female is considered a crime. "After birth of a child, it is mandatory to register its birth in the Village Administrative Office. If we fail to register, we have another option to do it later in the Taluk Office", he added.

He emphasised on Educational Rights such as Free and Compulsory Education for children under 14 years, 25% seats for poor children under Right To Education Act, Anti-ragging, Educational loans and so on. "TNPSC is a statutory body under the government of Tamil Nadu, its selection process, board and governance is maintained under the State Government. It is also abided by the laws related to education.", he said.

Apart from the laws related to education, he spoke on Marriage Act. He said that Marriage, divorce, adoption and inheritance are some of the laws that differs from one religion to another. However, the compulsory registration of marriage is applicable to every citizen irrespective of the religion they belong. He also said about Muslim Law of Marriage, divorce and inheritance, it varies at a greater scale from other religions. The rights on inheritance of properties is one of the aspect in which Muslim Laws differ, he said. According to Sharia Laws, one-third of the properties should be given to a person's daughters and its two-third is meant for the sons. The reason for this variation based on gender is due to the existence of Mahar system, in which the bride groom has to offer an amount or gold in return for the marriage. Moreover, the sons should also spend on the marriages of his sisters.

Mr. T. Panneer Selvam stressed on the Consumer Protection Act (1986), Information Technology Act (2000) and Legal Services Act (1987). He quoted that ignorance of law is not an excuse. That is the reason why every individual must be aware of the laws that we need to oblige.

The Legal services Authority is categorised as a federal system. It ranges from National Legal Services Authority, State Legal Services Authority, District Legal Services Authority and Taluk level authority. The services rendered by the district level authority includes legal aid services such as Sitting Council, mediation and LokAdalat.

Mr. P. Uma Shankar elucidated on how laws protect and rationalise the society and its people. He said that the reason for the uncontrolled activities of criminals is due to the fact that people are scared even to enter into police station to file a complaint. The criminals, hence, take an advantage and commit crimes endlessly.

He cited an example of Banwari Devi from Rajasthan who sacrificed her life to protect women's rights. It was after her death, that the law of protection of Women at workplace was amended. Conclusively, he said that learning is not the only purpose of going to a school or college, the real goal should be to promote and propagate the basic laws and its importance to people of all community.

Report of the Research activities for the academic year 2018-2019

The **Inauguration of the Student Research Forum** had a propitious launch with a prayer and illumination of the lamp on 25th July 2018 at San Jose Auditorium.

Dr.Sr.M. Francisca Flora the Secretary of Fatima College gave the presidential address and also felicitated the RAC for promoting the research culture. She shared a real time example of farming vegetables in home with the help of coconut wastes. She also shared that the heart and soul of good writing is research. She motivated the staff and students by pointing that research is the main creation of knowledge that will always leads to new and efficient solutions to face the need of the society.

Dr.S.Rajendran, Associate Professor and Chair, Unit of Rural Biotechnology, Saraswathi Narayanan College was the chief guest for that inaugural function. He displayed many of his innovative findings and the students were very much involved and impressed by his renowned speech. His talk was a mix together with interesting real time examples. Technical sessions were handled by experts from various institutions on the title "Information search strategy in Digital Era & Plagiarism" "Ethics & Copy right" and "Hands on experience on Plagiarism Softwares". The valedictory address was given by Dr. Sr. M. Francisca Flora, Secretary, Fatima College, Madurai.



Inaugural Session 15.03.2019

Technical session 1:

Dr. Leslie smith, Associate Professor of Religious Studies, Chair of Women's and Gender Studies Department, Avila university, USA accomplished the technical session on the topic "Issues and challenges of women in USA" – In her presentation, she narrated the situation and status of women in USA. Also, she mentioned about the challenges which are hindering the development of women in USA.

She highlighted the problems faced by women in family, society, work place, religious places, and politics and in media. Most of the women facing lot of problems such as mental disorders like eating disorders, stress and depression, child abuse, women trafficking, improper education, problems of Latin American, Native American and Black differences are still there in USA, she mentioned. Though, Gender discrimination is a evil, but they face many problems related gender discrimination in the form of wage discrimination-familial discrimination in decision making, discrimination in political participation are still existing in USA, she said. "Gender discrimination is not even recognized as discrimination but they making as a human nature" she mentioned.

Technical session 2:

"Social participation of Women in India" - this session hosted by Rev. Sr. A. Amala, Advocate, Madras High Court, and Madurai Bench. In her presentation, she shared about the status of Women in Vedic period, Literature period, Pre-Independence period, Post-Independence and in Contemporary society. In Vedic and literature period, the women had higher respect and equally treated as Goddesses, she said. In literature period also many

women poets and writers were recorded their writings, she mentioned. During pre-Independence era, the women literally suffered by Devadasi system, Sati, Child marriage. Etc., Also she mentioned the social activists, who worked for abolition of sati, Child marriage during Independence and post Independence era.

In present society, equally the good and evil are affecting the women she said. In present days, the women got freedom to study, to choose education and to go for job, but equally they are affected by child abuse, girl trafficking, raping, sexual harassment, violence against women in the society, she added. She has given many examples for participation and achievement of women in various fields like Politics, Technology, Media, Civil Services, Social services, Education and Economics.

Though, women are achieved the remarkable position in all fields. Still some women who are not yet reached the basic rights. Also she has given the alarm about the sexual harassment with increasing incidents in the present society.
