REPORT

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell of Fatima College, organized an two day Faculty Enrichment Programme with the objectives to disseminate the knowledge on "Quality in higher Education and NAAC –Challenges and Merits" and also to motivate the teaching fraternity to think out of the box by synergizing the concepts and to implement the procedure for re-assessment, mechanism for institutional appeals and accreditation of subsequent cycles.

The programme commenced with the prayer song. Mrs.P. Nancy Vincentina Mary, Assistant professor, Department of BCA, welcomed the gathering. Dr. M.Selvam, Syndicate member, Alagappa University, Senior advisor, IQAC, Bharathidasan University, resource person of the session presented the NAAC framework for Assessment and Accreditation based on the Core Values and Criteria for assessment and Key Indicators.

He made the presentation in to three session and the Session I deals with the curricular aspects, research innovation and extension. He highlighted the need of paradigm shift in quality of higher education. He accentuated about the nine R's and emphasised that the institution should have the practices in initiating a wide range of programme options and courses that are in tune with the emerging national and global trends and relevant to the local needs. He insisted the importance of implementing the value added course. He compared the traditional and integrated method of teaching and give information about dole's cone of experiences.

In Session II he explained the criterion on "Teaching learning and evaluation". It is the mainstay of any educational institution. He emphasised the Mckinsey 7 framework and Six sigma concepts and insisted the institution must leaned with the above concepts which increase the institutional excellence.



He discussed the importance of Infrastructure and learning resources, Student progression, Student Support, Governance, Leadership and Management, institutional values and best practices in session III. He contended that institution must provide necessary assistance to students, to enable them to acquire meaningful experiences for learning at the campus and to facilitate their holistic development and progression.

I. Vision, Mission and Charism:


a. Vision -Women of communion to be contemplative and prophetic for the life of the world.

a. Create database of alcoholic parents, conduct counselling sessions, care of common home, by collaboration with peace and justice team, social action team, WEAT project and model village.


b. Common cultural group, peace and justice club, and common De-addiction Centre.

12. Value Education Committee Staff Members and Certificate/Diploma Courses Committee Staff Members were fixed for the year.


13. All Departments discussed relating to Certificate Courses, value education curriculam,

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

About the College

Fatima College (Autonomous), Mary Land, Madurai, is a Postgraduate College for women affiliated to Madurai Kamaraj University. It is a Catholic Minority institution established and run by St. Joseph's Society of Madurai (of the Congregation of the Sisters of St. Joseph of Lyons, France). This institution came into existence through the tireless efforts of the missionary sisters of St. Joseph of Lyons and the zeal and heroic sacrifice of Rev.Sr. Rose Benedicta, the Foundress of the College.

The College was started with 63 students in 1953. It was upgraded and became a Postgraduate College in 1964 and autonomous in 1990. The College now offers 20 Undergraduate courses, 14 Postgraduate courses, 2 Professional courses, 5 M.Phil. courses and 6 departments have become Research Centres. It has 4510 students, 214 Teaching Staff and 95 Non-Teaching Staff.

About the Workshop

Higher Education Institutions across India have been taking large strides in moving ahead to face the new challenges put forward by the emergence of the Gen Z students of the new millennium. Most of them are visual learners and more than 65% of learning takes place through **audio-visual resources**. 

REPORT

Three-day 'Train the Trainer' National Workshop on Creating Alternative Digital Teaching Learning Environment in Higher Education Institutions Sponsored by United Board for Christian Higher Education in Asia Sept 6-8, 2018

Day 1 – Sept 6, 2018

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A three day 'National Workshop on Creating Alternative Digital Teaching Learning Environment in Higher Education Institution' sponsored by UBCHEA organised by IQAC was held in Fatima College (Autonomous), Madurai from 6th to 8th of September 2018. **63 Faculty members** from around **26 colleges** in and around Madurai enrolled themselves for the three day national workshop.

The inauguration programme started with an invocation to the almighty. Dr. S. Saira Banu, Associate Professor, The Research Centre of English, Fatima College, welcomed the erudite audience, including the resource person Prof. K. Samuel Johnson Israel, Vellore Institute of Technology, Andhra Pradesh, Dr. Sr. G. Celine Sahaya Mary, Principal, Fatima College and Dr. Mercy Pushpalatha, Former Principal, Lady Doak College and Member of United Board for Christian Higher Education in Asia.

A cheerful welcome was followed by the inaugural address of Dr. Sr. G. Celine Sahaya Mary. In the inaugural speech the principal stressed the need for a change in the role of a teacher to that of a facilitator. Through interesting anecdotes the principal reiterated the fact that e-learning and virtual classrooms are milestones in the evolution of a teacher from yester year 'gurukuls' to online classrooms.

Dr.Mercy Pushpalatha, felicitated the programme by highlighting the great divide between the Digital Natives and Digital Immigrants. She explained the need to bridge the gap with the help of alternative teaching methodology assisted with digital knowledge. She congratulated the staff participants – today's teachers who are Digital Immigrants for taking initiatives to meet the needs of Digital Natives. The inauguration programme came to a fitting closure with a Vote of Thanks rendered by Dr.J. Saral Evangelin, Assistant Professor and Head, Department of History, Fatima College.





The Plenary lecture-1 and the technical sessions I & II in the afternoon were delivered by eminent resource person Prof. K. Samuel Johnson Israel, Vellore Institute of Technology, Andhra Pradesh. In his unique style Prof. K. Samuel Johnson Israel handled the entire session without a moment of dullness. He spiced up digital knowledge with lot of fun and humour.

He introduced various tools and applications to assist e-learning in classrooms. The staff participants rollicked with laughter while intensely taking note of all the technical knowledge he rendered. The busy day came to a closure from a fitting tribute from Ms. S. Devasudha, Assistant Professor, The Research Centre of English, Fatima College, Madurai.

Day 2 - Sept 7, 2018

The Second day of the workshop began with a prayer song. Dr. J. Asnet Mary, Assistant Professor, Department of Zoology, Fatima College, introduced the resource person of the day Prof. Dr. K. Srinivas, Head ICT & Project Management Unit, National Institute of Educational & Planning & Administration (NIEPA), New Delhi and welcomed the gathering.

The plenary session of the day began at 9.45 a.m. Prof. Dr. K. Srinivas enlightened the participants about the uses of technology in classroom teaching and explained how technology serves as an enabler in teaching. He prepared the participants' mind set of being in a workshop by giving continual tasks and theoretical inputs then and there.

The first task he gave was to prepare an action plan which consists of the learning outcomes of the workshop, the short term and long term goals that are to be done after the three day workshop. He sensitized on the need for the teachers to be in alignment with technology to suit the modern generation learners. He explained the importance given to technology based teaching and learning by the government, NAAC, NIRF and other assessing and accrediting bodies. He gave valuable insights on SWAYAM, SWAYAM PRABHA, OER and MOOC.

He elaborately discussed the uses and methods of these online learning portals and made a live demonstration of how to register in these portals and also about the enrollment procedures for learners.

The practical session of the day started after the lunch break. Prof. Dr. K. Srinivas gave introduction to Moodle app that can be used in mobile and laptops and asked everyone to create their own Moddle learning site on the spot followed by his live demonstration.

He gave details of the apps like Screencastify, Presentation tube and some more apps that can be used for creating video lessons. Additionally, he also gave some tips like how to use Whatsapp in computers and how to download Youtube videos easily by ensave.net

He briefed about flipped classrooms and made the participants use all the apps and upload lessons in the Moodle site. He also gave assignments like uploading lessons in Moodle site and sending the links to him in Whatsapp and following the Action plan and making more innovations in teaching in online portals. All the participants enthusiastically participated in the practical session and raised doubts. Prof. Dr. K. Srinivas was patient enough to clear all the doubts and rectified all the trouble shooting that cropped up while doing the online portal. This fruitful one day program ended with a vote of thanks delivered by one of the participants.

Day 3 - Sept 8, 2018

The day started with prayer song. Welcome address given by Dr. Saral Evanjeline, Head & Assistant Professor, Department of History, Fatima College, Madurai. Plenary lecture was given by Dr. V. Sobhana Bai, Former Director, The Educational Multimedia Research Centre (EMRC), Madurai Kamaraj University, Madurai. She explained about ICT learning. She also spoke about vision 2020 and role and significance of teacher in teaching the e-content. She explained that the government has instigates initiatives to take ICT-based learning to the students of remote areas also. She spoke about the need for the teachers to upgrade their presentation and content, and for the replacement of chalk and talk method with technology. She emphasized the importance of script writing for e-content and how necessary it is to prepare the content based on the need of the students. ICT becomes students friendly through listening audio and video repeatedly. She also spoke about teacher's role in adopting tool or technology depending on the type of the learners, like for eg. For a group of illiterate learners the teachers can go for visual video and creative presentation. The role of ICT is important in creating learning interest among the students. She also spoke about the creation of group in social media for learning purpose. She also talked about the role of ICT in curriculum development, credibility of the content and its nature. She also explained about the ways of incorporating of econtent, elements and formats in the regular lesson plans of the teachers. She also elucidated the concept of MOOCs program.

Mr. N. Ramkeerthi, Producer, The Educational Multimedia Research Centre (EMRC), Madurai Kamaraj University, Madurai explained about the consortium for educational communication.



He explained the model of e-content with real examples. Vote of thanks was given by Mr.Tibi Thomas, Assistant Professor of English, Nesamani Memorial College, Marthandam.

Valedictory function


The welcome address was given by Dr. S. Saira Banu, Associate Professor, The Research Centre of English, Fatima College, Madurai.



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

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

FATIMA COLLEGE (AUTONOMOUS), MADURAI ORGANISED BY IQAC 3- DAY FACULTY TRAINING PROGRAMME FOR NEWLY APPOINTED STAFF – 2018 -19 June 28 to 30, 2018

REPORT

The IQAC of Fatima College organised an training programme from 28th to 30th of June 2018 for a period of three days for the young staff with experience of 3 years and less with an objective of moulding and fine tuning young minds in order to familiarise them with the demands and expectations of their teaching profession.

On 28th June the programme began with Dr. Sr. Francisca Flora, the Secretary of the college, giving an overview of Fatima culture, rooted and nourished by the ideals of communion and collaboration for the betterment of people at the periphery. Sister enlightened the importance of transparency, humility and forgiveness as qualities that place the young minds and hearts on track in fulfilling the vision and mission of the college. The session was followed by the thought provoking words of Dr. Sr. G. Celine Sahaya Mary, the Principal on the title 'Teacher quality''. She emphasised the importance of commitment and strong ethical values in addition to knowledge capital.

Dr. S. SairaBanu, Assistant Coordinator, IQAC, from the Research Centre of English, highlighted the importance of non verbal communication using gestures and postures in class rooms and off the class. She hammered the idea of grafting and keeping the attention of students very effectively using positive body language, which can be used for better presentation.

Dr. Saira continued with Body Language on the 29th June, 2018 where she stressed the importance of tonal modulations in voice, eye contact and mobility of teacher in a classroom.

The Fourth Session of the Training Programme was presented by Dr. J. Asnet Mary, Assistant Professor of the Department of Zoology. She shared her experiences at the college, which were profound and down to earth. She started the session with a song "Good morning my dear Friends". She highlighted on the significance of behaviour and attitude of being a Teacher for Transformation. She explained about the key points for Transformation: ie. Be Proactive Not Reactive, Begin with the End in Mind, Think Win



and Win. With the example of the life cycle of the Butterfly she insisted on being a proactive individual, on developing the habit of being responsible and taking initiative.

Her experiential sharing on field experience, on skill based course in Vermiculture and Mock Parliament organized by the Department of Sociology and Social Work was very inspiring. This made the participants to visualize the concepts such as "**Keep Trying and Don't Keep Boundaries.**" Begin with the End in Mind: Under this heading she started with an exercise of drawing the shapes like square circle and rectangle. Through this she made the participants understand the fact that in order to get transformed, individual should plan after visualizing the outcome. To move from Good to Great, root activities and fruit activities are vital. Human knot was the exercise given to the participants to get in to the topic Think Win and Win. Significance of Teamwork was realized by the participants.

The fifth session was spiced with psychological inputs from Dr. Sr. Francis Paulin, the student Counsellor and Former Secretary of Fatima College. She emphasized that identification of one's own feeling is very important for self awareness. She spoke about Self Awareness, Self Management, Self Motivation, Empathy and Social Skills. This made the participants to internalize the necessity of thinking positively and thinking beyond. She concluded the session with the impression "Our Emotions are Our Power."

The sixth session of Staff Training Programme was handled by Rev. Sr.EmilyJeseph, the student Counsellor and Former Provincial, St. Joseph of Lyons Indian Province, entitled "The power within you presented". The session started with some brain storming. Sister talked about Emotional Intelligence and its role. Initially Sister listed out the different types of intelligence like what feels good, what feels bad, and how to get move from bad to good. Sister explained the definition of Emotional Intelligenceaccording to Daniel Goleman (1998) "the capacity for recognizing our own feelings and those of others, for motivating ourselves and others in our relationships, Emotional Intelligence describes abilities distinct from, but complementary to academic intelligence." In her speech, she highlighted the difference between EQ and IQ. The Emotional Intelligence, or Emotional Quotient (EQ), is defined as an individual's ability to identify, evaluate, control, and express emotions. People with high EQ usually make great leaders and team players because of their ability to understand, empathize and connect with the people around them. IQ, or Intelligence Quotient, is a score derived from one of several standardized tests designed to assess an individual's intelligence.IQ is used to determine



academic abilities and identify individuals with off-the-chart intelligence or mental challenges.

EQ is a better indicator of success in the workplace and is used to identify leaders, good team players.Self awareness, self identity, pro activity, and maturity in handling situations were given a bird's eye view. Power within self is what that makes individuals to excel given a situation- bright or bleak.

The day ended with the session presented by Dr. Vasantha Esther Rani, Head, Research Centre of Home Science with Food Biotechnology, who gave pearls of wisdom on research and the various funding agencies that are supporting researchers. A brief outline was given on the preparation, submission and presentation of research proposals, bringing to the audience a personal touch to it. Perhaps, to her, research is not a single affair but buds from every day experiences and lessons from in and out. She also discussed about types of research, What is Research Proposal, Components of Research Proposal, Research Funding Agencies like:

- Department of Science and technology(DST)
- Atomic Energy Regulatory Board (AERB)
- Aeronautics **Research** and Development Board (ARDB)
- Board of **Research** in Nuclear Sciences (BRNS)
- Council of Scientific& Industrial Research (CSIR)
- Defence **Research**& Development Organisation (DRDO)
- Department of Atomic Energy.
- Department of Biotechnology (DBT)
- Department of Food Processing Industries
- Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MOW).
- Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR)
- Indian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR)

The third day programme -30^{th} June was flagged off by Dr. S. J. Kala of the Research Centre of English who spoke about innovativeness in teaching. The past, present and future were synchronised and the demands of the present age were delicately conveyed to the members. One needs love and passion to perform creatively in classroom environment.

importance of curriculum design as per OBE norms. He briefed the taxonomy of cognitive levels for learning objectives as proposed by psychologist Benjamin Bloom.






The programmed organized on July 28th, 2018 was meant for the support staff.

Dr.Ms.A. Vimala, Coordinator, Fatima Online and Digital Education (FONDE) convened a meeting on E-Content production for MOOCs, Online course and Foundation Course for all the FONDE members and Heads the departments. FOUNDATION COURSE is offered as online program which is comfortable, convenient, flexible and also it motivates the students for self-paced learning. The course is available with Syllabus, course content in the form of videos - prepared by our staff members with the transcript and question bank with minimum of 50 questions from each stream. - MOOCs can be offered as Extra Credit or it can offered as part of the curricula to facilitate blended method of Teaching methodology.
- Once the learner acquires the credit, it can be entered in the cumulative marksheet.
