



- a) Graduates who have completed the bachelor's degree at FC can earn Binary degree which is internationally recognized by completing 4 modules and a thesis in 1 semester.
- Fees : The special fees for this arrangement is RM 12,000( Approx USD 3,000) b) Graduates who have completed Naster's degree at FC can earn the Binary MBA by completing 3 modules and a thesis in 1 semester.
- Fees : The special fees for this arrangement is RM 11,000( Approx USD 2,750) Note :Students enrolling on this program must have achieved a minimum grade of 70% (B+) or CGPA of 3.00

#### 2.6 Study Abroad Program ( Credit & Non - Credit)

Both institution agree to promote its SAP to its students. Such students will bear tuition frees charged by the host institution. A special fee has been approved by Senate as recognition of this MOA. SAP programs can be completed between weeks (non credit) and 4 months (1 semester) for Credit based. Details of the spe SAP will be agreed on a "project buy project basis".

#### 3.0 Contact Person

So Contact Person Both the institutions will designate a contact person assigned with the responsibility of coordinating MOA activities in general terms. Biogas Plant was installed to reduce consumption of LPG in the Hostel Mess and to produce organic manure. As an outcome there is a reduction of 2 LPG cylinders per month. Solar panels were installed in the administrative block and in one block of Hostel.
In collaboration with Galaxy IAS Academy coaching classes for IAS aspirants were conducted. 135 students benefitted out of the 300 hours course.
Conducted skill training programmes for students from other colleges. One startup on tailoring was initiated.
Conducted "Demonstration & Training of Fire Extinguishers & Fire Safety" to 68 Non-Teaching staff.
