Xavier Board of Higher Education in India – Tamilnadu region conducted a one day National Seminar on “Inspirational Leadership for Higher Educational Institutions in India in the 21st Century”. It was jointly organised by Fatima College (Autonomous) Madurai and St. Joseph's College (Autonomous), Tiruchirappalli at Fatima College. 78 participants including Principals, Vice Principals, Heads of the Departments, IQAC Co-ordinators and other senior Faculty Members from various colleges in Tamilnadu and Andhra Pradesh participated in the seminar. The seminar was inaugurated with a welcome by Dr. Sr. G. Celine Sahaya Mary, Vice President, Xavier Board – Tamilnadu Region and Principal, Fatima College. In his Presidential Address Rev. Dr. M. Arockiasamy Xavier, President, Xavier Board – Tamilnadu Region and Principal, St. Joseph's College, Tiruchirappalli stressed on the three major qualities of an inspirational leader: attitude, way of life and transformation of society. On 18th August 2019 Rev. Dr. Francis Xavier's SJ, the resource person gave an input session on **“Dynamic trends in Education”**. In his session he shared about what is education and what for education. Education is the key to fight against anything. Education need to be skill based. “To destroy a nation you do not need atom bomb or destructive violence; just dilute the quality of education”.

Education has to improve one's creativity, competency, commitment and compassion. Each student is a potential leader and has something to offer to the society. Dream big, think noble, work wonder and achieve greater things.



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In his sharing he stressed perspective of education such as empowerment of the marginalized. The learning outcome in higher education can be seen as a development from outcome-based education within the vocational sector. In the vocational sector learning outcomes based on competencies are used to underpin the assessment of job-related skills. The pedagogic purposes of learning outcomes are clear, in that they are designed to give a clear indication of the learning destiny, that the learning opportunity provider intends the learner to reach. In doing-so they give power to the learner, as armed with knowledge of the destiny the learner can if they wish, chart their own journey to this destination. It is this potential for empowerment which allows the proponents of outcomes-based education to claim that is "student-cantered".

On 17th September 2017 an input session was arranged for the administrators of the College. The resource person for the session was Rev. Fr.Jagath Caspar Raj. The theme of the session was **“Eco sustainability”**. He insisted on the importance of green village in and around us.

A Green Village is one which offers access to clean energy, adequate water, basic education, good healthcare, hygienic sanitation, leading to economic prosperity and enhanced quality of life, in a manner that is environmentally sustainable, specifically in the background of green cover loss caused by cyclone Vardah. Planting one lakh of well grown saplings, not less than 4.5 feet size, before the monsoon. THE REGREEN VILLAGE project inspired, encouraged, facilitated and supported like-minded groups and individuals to plant as many number as possible to reach a target of five lakh



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over a period of five years. Native species of trees which have endurance to natural disasters and drought, namely Pungai Maram, Poovarasu, Vembu, Naaval, Naagalingam, PanaiMaram, Maa Maram, NelliMaram are to be planted.

In the process a massive awareness about urban disaster risks and ways to be prepared for them, creating a pool of technology and information-enabled disaster volunteers in multiple locations was raised. There is also a need to bring in personal attitude changes that in the long run will critically contribute to urban disaster risk reduction. To support our healthy and peaceful living on the earth, people need to come together and support.

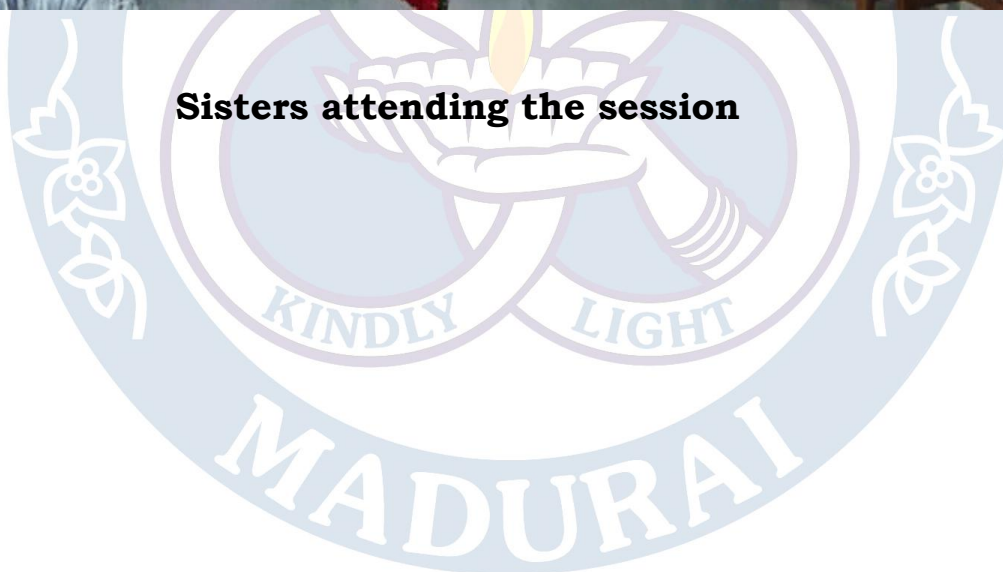
