The green club of Fatima College has taken new initiative of instituting bottle garden on campus. This initiative was taken to create awareness among students for creating green environment using bottles in minimal space. The green club students were asked to bring plastic water bottles from their houses in the month of October 2018. Many bottles were collected and cut in a specified manner to grow plants. On October 11, 2018 the bottles were filled with sand and some flowering plants like crotons were planted in them. The filled bottles were arranged on a stand and kept in the ground where the sunlight falls. The plants are watered by the students taking turns. The growth of the plants is absorbed regularly by the students. This has created interest among the students to have bottle gardens at their houses. Students learn to reuse waste bottles to create green environment. Students learnt about the plants that absorb more amount of CO₂.

Our students designed the Bird feeder to feed the birds in our college. Its main motto is to increase the number of birds and total species in our college campus. The waste bottles were collected from the students and they made it useful. They filled the bottles with sand in the bottom layer and the different kinds of grains were mixed and filled at the top layers. This activity increases the interest of the students to breed the birds and to know the significance of birds in ecosystem. They learned to reuse the waste bottles into artificial nest and bird feeders.

Outcome: Students have learnt the importance of birds, their role in maintaining the ecological balance, and the destruction of their habitats and scarcity for food; they learnt to prepare simple birdfeeders using waste plastic bottles.




