Phase – I: Fund collection from Staff and students.

Phase – II: Sales Day organised to raise funds for the cause by staff and students.

Phase – III: Contribution of household materials and toiletries.

Phase – IV: Collection of newspapers from the neighbourhood to raise funds through their sales.

Phase – V: Rs.11,31,279/- was mobilized. Reaching out to the worst affected areas of Siruvathur, Railway Colony, EriKarai Colony, Housing Board Colony, Vallam, C NPalayam in Cuddalore and Pandruti. Each affected family in the village was provided with basic utensils for cooking, a pack of groceries consisting of 10 Kgs of **rice, dal and spices, sarees, dhoties, towels and bedspreads.**

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MUSIC THERAPY FOR CANCER PATIENTS

Fatima College, with The Ashwin Maharaj Foundation - an NGO, is entrusted in giving music therapy sessions for the cancer patients at Government Rajaji Hospital, Madurai. **2 AICUF students and Four NSS volunteers are accompanied by Dr. Angel to visit Cancer Centre, Oncology division, Government Rajaji Hospital twice in a month to give music therapy for cancer patients.**

This music therapy is a part of a complementary medicine program in supportive cancer care which accompanies medical treatment. Music therapy for cancer patients—interactive music therapy techniques (instrumental improvisation, singing) as well as receptive music therapy techniques (listening to recorded or live music, music and imaginary) are used to improve mood, decrease stress, pain, anxiety level and enhance relaxation. This therapy is an effective form of supporting cancer care for patients during the treatment process which is also basic for planning effective programs of rehabilitation to promote wellness, improve physical and emotional well-being and the quality of life.
