ENGLISH ATTAINMENT TEST (EAT)

English Attainment Test (EAT), a unique annual feature of the Research Centre of English was conducted on June 19, 2019. It is organised for the first year Undergraduates on their first day in college to test the level of their competency in English.

Based on their scores in the EAT the students are divided into three different streams-BASIC, INTERMEDIATE and ADVANCED.

On their first day of college, 626 students took 1 hour test between 11.10 a.m to 12.05 p.m. EAT was also conducted for the students who were admitted late. They were divided into 11 sections as follows for their Bridge Courses (from June 20 to August 5, 2019) as well as Part-II English classes:
