

Reach Out to Society through Action (ROSA)

ROSA is the flagship for Extension activities of Fatima College. Initiated in 2006-2007 ROSA aims at providing opportunities for experiential education for the students, enabling them to apply the knowledge they acquire in classrooms for the benefit of the neighbourhood community. It is in line with the College Vision: "...to empower women by developing human capabilities through quality education ...making them responsible citizens who can work for the advancement of the society..."

Extension activity is designed as an **off-campus program with 3 credits** for the Final year students. It has a general objective of the upliftment of the underprivileged, reaching out to the unreachable, caring for the education and health of rural children, revitalizing the self-confidence of young women and making them financially independent by providing them entrepreneurship skills.

The activities are streamlined and focused on women, children and youth, covering health, literacy, women empowerment, environmental awareness and other concerns of our times. Fatima College is working for the development of **16 villages** in Vadipatti Taluk.

Unnat Bharat Abhiyan 2.0

Unnat Bharat Abhiyan is a flagship programme of the Ministry of Human Resource Development with the intention to enrich Rural India. Fatima College is one of the TIMA COLLEGE

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Participating Institution selected in a challenge mode based on our contribution to societal development.

As per requirement, our institution has identified 5 villages namely ThirumalNatham, Nedungulam, Vadugapatti, Ambalathadi and Kondayampatti in consultation with the District Collector and have built good rapport with people. So far the college has conducted **Participatory Rural Appraisal** and formed Stakeholders committee in each village.

Village survey and house hold survey has been carried out. The students have actively participated in identifying natural and human resources available in each village with the view to match those resources with the actual needs of the local people.

Summer internship programme was organized in Kondaympatti village and addressed to the education, health and environmental issues of the village. The faculty and students participated in **Gram Sabha** meeting on August 15th in all the UBA villages and identified key problems to be addressed.

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
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
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


INITIATIVE OF ROSA FOR GREEN DIWALI - 2020



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IMPACT OF UBA INTERVENTION

The positive changes in the neighborhood community are due to the intervention of UBA. The first and foremost effort taken is to study the demography through data collection through survey of villages& households. This survey enabled the students to build a rapport with the villagers. It also helped the students to identify the natural and human resources and make them carry out the activities with greater effort using PRA mapping .The stakeholders committees were formed comprising school teachers, nurses, VAO , *Balwadi* teachers, health inspectors, women and children and the youth. The formation of Committees enabled in effective implementation of activities.

Summer Internship Programme:

The students were enabled to share their talents with their neighborhood community through Summer Internship. The learner's community painted on walls of the school based on the theme significance of "Clean and Green India". This is a remarkable contribution of the youth to the community which indirectly makes the children give back to the society. In all the endeavors women and children were given a special focus to draw them out from their backwardness.

Focus on Children:

Special focus was given to village children by our students and faculty members. Children's day, summer camps were organized in order to bring out their latent talent, instill leadership skills and increase their active participation. Significant days at both national and international levels were observed to inculcate patriotism and awareness among the school children. Children's Parliament was formed. Children learnt the duties and responsibilities of the leader which shapes their personality.



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Fatina College

The Fatimites are trained in preparation of **seed ball and paper bags** and in turn they train the school children in order to safeguard the environment. The programme was effective for all age groups particularly for children. Tutoring made the students enhance their learning skills. Value education classes made them understand the significance of values, respect for elders and help to be rendered at the times of need. **Computer literacy programme** made the children familiar with computer and its operations. They also taught them the importance of maintaining a hygienic environment in order to gain good health and safe guard the environment.

Empowerment of Women:

Awareness programmes were organized on health and hygiene, women's rights and environment related health issues. The students were trained to develop their skill in preparing detergent soap, phenol and incense, making jewellery, paper bags and garments. Some women were transformed into entrepreneurs thus generating income for the family.

Kondayampatti, a village selected under UBA, is one of the adopted villages for extension activities. A team of five members, including the staff in charge of the Extension Programme visited and attended the Stakeholders meeting of Kondayampatti village on 04.08.2019. The team observed the village and made friendly interactions with the villagers, in order to ascertain the issues to be addressed. The team explained the purpose of their visit to the village and about having conducted tuition, medical camp, spreading awareness about Dengue &Malaria in the last 4 years and about need of creation of the Stakeholder's Group.

Further it was decided to conduct the meeting once in a month and to take tuition for the students of the village and to conduct workshops for village women on small jobs that can be done at their houses. Further, the following problems faced by the village people were discussed.

- Toilet facility is not available to both male & female villagers. Available toilets are not maintained.
- No water facility available
- No Bus facility
- ➤ No compound wall available in the school

The villagers were convinced on the need to moving towards a clean India, and their cooperation in making Kondayampatti clean was elicited.

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

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AGRI EXPO 2019

On February 16th and 17th 2019 **NEWS 18 Tamilnadu channel** organized a mega Agri 2019 expo-cum- award function at Gandhi Museum, Gandhi Nagar, Madurai. The Students from the Department of Zoology and Department of Home Science participated in the events. 75 students were engaged in preparing 1500 seed balls. **The seed ball preparation** started a week before the commencement of Agri Expo 2019. Ms.Thirumamagal Natchiar Zoology co-ordinated the students in preparing seed balls under the guidance of Dr. X. Devanya Rosaline and Dr. N.Nagarani. The wild or native seeds of different types were procured from Tamil Nadu Agriculture Society.

Apart from seed ball preparation the students from the Department of Zoology also gave awareness regarding cultivation of *Aloe Vera* as an alternative crop during drought conditions. They pointed out the uses and application of *Aloe Vera* gel in medicine, cosmetics, pharmaceutical industry.

Students from the Department of Home Science designed a Drip irrigation models and created awareness on the subsidiary available in Tamil Nadu for the growth of agriculture and welfare of the farmers. They demonstrated the methods regarding cost effective way to preserve the delicate crops.

SWACHH BHARAT SUMMER INTERNSHIP - 2018

Swachh Bharat Summer Internship (SBSI) is to engage youth across the country and develop their skill and orientation for sanitation related work and village level development. The program aims to bring youth across the country an opportunity to make a significant contribution to the swachhata revolution. Duration of this program is **100 hours**. Candidates may participate individually or in teams. Candidates are eligible to choose between the State of Residence and State of Parent Institution as the location of internship (village/district).

In Fatima College, 50 students have registered for this program in a team of 10 students each. They worked in Kondaympatti village, Alanganallur block, Madurai for 100 hours in **15 days from 28th May to 13th June, 2018.** They actively participated in *Swachh Bharat* work in various themes like, solid waste management, composting pit, sanitation, open defecation free environment.

The students worked on the projects like organic waste composting project, awareness project on personal health, women & adolescence, creating awareness on better sanitation practices, collection and segregation of solid waste into biodegradable and non-biodegradable waste and creating awareness on cleanliness through Wall painting in Kondayampatti village.

Valedictory function was conducted on 13th June, 2018, 3.00 pm at Kondaymapatti village in the presence of the Principal, Dr. Sr. G. Celine Sahaya Mary. Team leaders reported their 15 days activity and shared their personal experience how it was helpful for their personality development.

Students of Fatima College had interesting opportunities and obstacles thanks to Swachh Bharat programme, an initiative under the Swachh Bharat Mission.

Fifty of them, organised into groups of 10, tried to tackle basic cleanliness and hygiene-related issues at Kondaympatti in Alanganallur block.

The 15-day programme began on May 28.

"We were beginning to understand the pulse of the public and working strategically with them. It is sad that the programme is coming to an end," said L.R. Bharathi, a third year student-leader.

The programme is part of Central government ministries of human resource development, drinking water and sanitation and youth affairs and sports.

Every student should contribute 100 hours of service in a village between May 1 and July 31 and will be provided with certificates and credits. Those doing exceptional work will be given

The students focused on solid waste management, vermi-composting and personal hygiene.

P. Pradeepa, a third-year student, said that she headed the solid waste management team. They taught young children and their parents to segregate biodegradable and non-biodegradable waste through small exhibitions and demonstrations. They showed them how to reduce, reuse and recycle plastic in innovative ways through video shows.

"For the first three days, we inspected the village and began interacting with the residents. We found it easy to reach school children as they grasped concepts easi-

ly," she said. Ms. Bharathi said that she took charge of personal hygiene for children, adoles-cents and women. The students enacted street plays, taught hand-washing techniques and cleaned public places like bus stops.

"It gave us good exposure and taught us that we too could make a small difference," she said. Both she and Ms. Prathiba agreed that they would be back at Kondaympatti to ensure sustainable and practical improve-

Their last day at the village was over.






